

The North Corner Stone is located in the 1800 block of East-West Highway. It is located approximately 40 feet south of the centerline of the highway and it aligns with the western side of the Summit Hills Apartment Building. The sandstone marker is slightly damaged and has sunk; it is in fair condition. A 6'8" iron fence, in good condition, surrounds the marker.

An expanded statement of significance is given in the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia Multiple Documentation Form.

The North Corner boundary stone was the seventh marker to be located in Maryland. It was laid in 1792. Its fence was dedicated on April 14, 1916 by the State of Maryland, Daughters of the American Revolution. (The North Corner stone is succeeded by Northeast #2 because Northeast #1 no longer exists. A plaque set in a sidewalk has marked the original location of Northeast #1 since 1960.)

The stone is located approximately 40 feet south of the centerline of East-West Highway (1800 block) and it aligns with the western side of the Summit Hills Apartment Building. The fence surrounds the stone.

Boundary Justification:

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
