NAME Utica Depot

LOCATION Lots 7, 8, 9, and 10, Block 2, original town of Utica

OWNER Clement C. Fejfar

DESCRIPTION

The Utica Depot is a one story building constructed in the 1890's. The rectangular structure with its wide overhanging bracketed eaves is a standardized depot design constructed by railroads in many rural locations. The depot has belled siding, an irregular stone foundation; a bay window and the main door are located on the front (south) facade. A tin shed was attached to the north facade in the 1960's.

STYLE Vernacular

DATE 1890's

SIGNIFICANCE Utica Depot is significant in commerce and transportation to the resource area. Constructed in the 1890's, the facility served as a terminal for the shipping of farm products and the receiving of agricultural supplies. For many years, these depots served as the vital link for rural areas and the commercial processes of agriculture. Most of the other railroad stations in Yankton County have been torn down, adding to the significance of this depot.

ACREAGE less than 1

BOUNDARIES The nominated property is located 600 feet west of the north-southeast Chicago Milwaukee St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Line and 1 block north of the Utica Public School.
