Description

The Dr. Clay House is a one-and-one-half story, wood frame residence designed in a more high-style version of the Folk Victorian style. Its irregular plan is only enhanced by its complex, combination gable/hipped/shed roofline. The central, hipped roof block is augmented by the gabled wall dormer on the front, the gabled bays on the northwestern and southeastern elevations, and the shed roof front porch and later rear addition. Two large brick chimneys rise through the flat section atop the hipped roof. The asphalt shingle roof and wood weatherboarded walls rest upon a continuous brick foundation.

The principle entrance into the building is through the single-leaf entrance beneath the shed roof front porch on the southeastern elevation. The porch roof is supported by a row of six turned wood posts that are ornamented at their cornice intersections with decorative gingerbread and connected below with a turned wood balustrade. The wall dormer above is fenestrated with a grouping of three windows, the central of which is larger and taller than the two flanking windows. Another single-leaf entrance provides access into the northwestern elevation of the shed roof addition to the northeast, and another single-leaf entrance provides access through the northwestern wall of the shed roof addition. The fenestration throughout is largely limited to one-over-one wood sash windows of various sizes, the only exception to which are the two three-over-one Craftsman windows in the rear shed addition and a few single-pane fixed windows.

Significance

Criteria C, local significance

The Dr. Clay House was constructed in 1907 by an unknown builder for Dr. Clay, its first occupant. Dr. Clay was one of several local medical doctors in Leslie whose clientele consisted primarily of workers from both the Missouri and North Arkansas Railroad and the various timber-related industries that surrounded Leslie.

The Dr. Clay House was constructed as a residence in Leslie during the first decade of the twentieth century and as such represents the historic context Searcy County History, 1865-1910: Reconstruction, Railroads and Renewal. As noted in this context, this was a period of county-wide growth and prosperity, relatively speaking, and thus a period during which there was much new immigration, and so much new construction. The fact that a young medical doctor would settle here, in what up until that time had been one of Arkansas's most rural and isolated counties, speaks to the optimism attendant upon the growth of the various lumbering industries that flourished among the forests of Searcy County during the late nineteenth century and what many saw as the new era of development heralded by the arrival of the railroad. With this hope and prosperity, combined with the long-standing presence of the railroad, it was inevitable that new, national architectural styles would be reflected. As the finest example of the Folk Victorian style in Leslie, the Dr. Clay House is locally eligible under Criterion C.
