

#### 7. DESCRIPTION

Located approximately six and one-half miles northwest of downtown Hazlehurst on the old Raymond-Gallatin stagecoach road now known as the Dentville Road, the Tabernacle Methodist Church is a vernacular, frame, gable-front church building constructed in 1857. The church is situated in a clearing of a heavily wooded area and faces south onto the Dentville Road. Directly behind the church is a small cemetery, which contains mostly twentieth century gravestones enclosed by a low cyclone fence.

Resting on sandstone block foundation piers, the church is a two-byfour bay structure crowned by a standing seam metal roof trimmed with
a box cornice with incomplete returns. The main (south) facade has
two bays, each containing double-leaf, six-panel doors topped by a
wide, eight-light transom. A metal awning is above the eastern door.
Both side elevations feature four nine-over-nine, double-hung
windows. The rear elevation has a central, nine-over-nine, doublehung window protected by four-panel shutters that appear to be
original, and on the eastern end of the elevation is a single-leaf,
six-panel door with three-light transom. All openings are trimmed
with plain narrow surrounds, and although there is evidence that all
window openings were at one time protected by shutters, only those on
the rear window remain in place.

The one-room interior of the church retains its original pews placed to either side of a central aisle, altar, and curved altar rail with plain newel posts and turned balusters. The altar is situated on a dais and has ornate carved detailing (see Photo Nos. 2 & 3). Apparently around the turn of the century the ceiling and walls were clad in beaded board, and about 25 years ago new hardwood floors were installed. Although the building does not retain its original wall and ceiling finishes, the present finishes were installed about one hundred years ago and do not detract from the character of the building. Overall, the church retains a high degree of architectural integrity.

The cemetery is counted as a noncontributing site because most of the gravestones appear to date from the twentieth century.

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#### 8. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built in 1857, the Tabernacle Methodist Church is locally significant for its architectural character (Criterion C), being a good example of a vernacular, antebellum, wooden, gable-front church building with two entrances in the gable end. It is one of only two antebellum churches known at this time to survive in Copiah County, the other being the Pleasant Valley Methodist Church (circa 1840), located about 14 miles southwest of Hazlehurst.

The Registration Requirements for Religious Resources are discussed on pages 67-69 of the MPS cover document entitled "Historic and Architectural Resources of Copiah County, Mississippi." associated historic context developed in the MPS cover document and represented by this property is "The Plantation Era in Copiah County, 1823-1865.") The Tabernacle Methodist Church was evaluated using the Mississippi Department of Archives and History's quidelines for assessing vernacular churches and was found to be eligible because it is a rare surviving example of an antebellum, gable-front church with two entrances in the gable end and because it displays a high degree of physical integrity. The exterior of the building has not been altered except for the removal of the original shutters from all but the rear window. Although the interior walls and ceiling were clad in beaded board in the 1890s, the interior has its original pews, altar, and altar rail. The building retains integrity of location, and the setting remains as it was historically -- a small clearing in a rural, wooded area. The building also retains a high degree of integrity of feeling and association.

The congregation of the Tabernacle Methodist Church is no longer active, but a homecoming is held here annually. The church is under the care of the Cemetery Association and is being well maintained.

#### 10. GEOGRAPHICAL DATA

<u>Verbal Boundary Description</u>: That portion of Parcel 12 lying east of the Dentville Road, as shown on Map No. 73 in the Copiah County Tax Assessor's Office. The property is located in the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 23, Township 1 North, Range 3 West.

Boundary Justification: The boundaries being nominated include 1.9 of the 2.0 acres historically associated with the church and owned by the present property owners. One-tenth acre was excluded from the boundaries being nominated because it is separated from the remainder of the church property by the Dentville Road.
