Summary

The Arkadelphia Confederate Monument faces north on the southeast side of the Clark County Courthouse's front lawn. Built under the direction of R. P. Phillips, it depicts a Confederate soldier about to leave for war. The figure is standing with his proper left foot forward and both hands are grasping his rifle, which is resting in front with the butt to the ground. He is wearing a hat and is gazing forward, his blanket roll draped across his proper left shoulder. A canteen is attached to the proper right side of his belt, and a scabbard is fastened to the belt on the proper left side. The sculpture, which was carved in Italy from Italian marble, is 72"x18"x18". The base, made of Georgia marble, stands 21'x7"x7".

Elaboration

The Arkadelphia Confederate Monument faces north on the southeast side of the Clark County Courthouse's front lawn. Built under the direction of R. P. Phillips, it depicts a Confederate soldier about to leave for war. The figure is standing with his proper left foot forward and both hands are grasping his rifle, which is resting in front with the butt to the ground. The sculpture, which was carved in Italy from Italian marble, is 72"x18"x18". The base, made of Georgia marble, stands 21'x7"x7".

Inscribed on the north side of the shaft and base is "C. S. A. / MAY - 1911 / 1861 - 1866." Also on this side of the base is a pair of crossed Confederate flags.

On the south side of the base is the inscription "WHEN THE LAST TRUMPET / IS SOUNDED, MAY EACH ONE / ANSWER THE ROLL CALL / OF THE HEAVENLY ARMY."

The east side of the base reads "THE PRINCIPLES FOR / WHICH THEY FOUGHT LIVE ETERNALLY." Beneath that, on the same side, is the inscription "ERECTED BY / THE HARRIS FLANAGIN CHAPTER, U.D.C. / TO THE MEMORY OF THE SOLDIERS / OF THE SOUTHERN CONFEDERACY / WHOSE INVINCIBLE COURAGE MADE / A HUNDRED BATTLE FIELDS FAMOUS / AND WHOSE UNSELFISH DEVOTION TO A / PRINCIPLE MADE THEIR CAUSE GLORIOUS."

The west side of the base is marked with the inscription "ON FAME'S ETERNAL CAMPING / GROUND / THEIR SILENT TENTS ARE / SPREAD; / AND GLORY GUARDS WITH / SOLEMN ROUND / THE BIVOUAC OF THE DEAD."

At the time of the 1993 SOS! survey both the base and sculpture's base joints were washed out. The scabbard was nicked in two places as was the front edge of the rim of the hat. Both the base and sculpture suffered from bird guano, black crusts, organic growth, and sugaring.

The Arkadelphia Confederate Monument is associated with the historic context "Something So Dim It Must Be Holy": Civil War Commemorative Sculpture In Arkansas, 1886-1934 as a commemorative monument financed and erected through the efforts of an descendants' organization in Arkansas. As such it is eligible under Criterion A with statewide significance for its associations with the efforts of the Harris Flanagin Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy to reflect members' perception of the noble character and valor of their veterans and their cause.

Elaboration

The Arkadelphia Monument was sponsored by the Harris Flanagin Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, which raised approximately \$1,500 for their tribute to the Confederate soldiers. On Saturday May 27, 1911, the new monument was unveiled as part of a grand ceremony that lasted from 10 A.M. to late afternoon. Arkadelphia residents, out-of-town visitors, and Confederate veterans crowded onto the courthouse lawn for the program that included music, prayers, and speeches by local dignitaries. The Arkadelphia Southern Standard reported that when the monument was finally revealed, "a mighty shout went up from the throng and the pulsations of old and young alike were quickened."


