DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The original Stock Judging Pavilion was one (1) story of approximately 5500 square feet (55'0" X 100'0") with perimeter pipe tunnels and center first floor for animal shows and exhibits. There were, and are, concrete seating risers above animal holding pens which had an exterior grade entrance ramped to the show ring on the main floor. The exterior walls are (min.) 12" masonry and the roof is heavy timber, supported by exposed structural steel trusses. The original roof was clay tile, presently the roof is of asphalt shingles. A cupola and two other skylights were on the original building but these have been removed and replaced with solid timber.

A two story addition of approximately 9,000 square feet was built at the west end of the original building in 1925 forming an "L" to the north. The construction of this addition was the same as the original, except that the main floor was a 7½" two-way reinforced concrete. The main floor of the addition was designed and has been used as animal science classrooms and the ground floor was designed and has been used as a meat science laboratory with coolers, freezers, abattoir, and meat processing areas.

Stylistically the building is a Neo-classical structure, almost Beaux Arts in composition but lacking that school's grand scale.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The original Stock Judging Pavilion was built in 1918 as the livestock teaching facility on the State of South Dakota's Land Grant College. The building has served in this capacity with additional space for classrooms and meat processing added in 1925 for the past 59 years. During the last year of its existence it has been the location of the state's Agricultural Heritage Museum.

The Neo-classical architecture of the building is representative of institutional buildings of that period (1900-1925). It is one of the campus's more interesting and appealing structures.

The Stock Judging Pavilion has served as the teaching facility for many students. Because agriculture is South Dakota's primary industry, the instruction in stock judging and meat science received in the building made a considerable contribution to the state's economy. Graduates of the University applied their knowledge to upgrade the quality of the state's livestock to improve livestock sales. Until the building was vacated in 1977, Little International, an agricultural exposition, was held there each year, attracting many thousands of South Dakotans over the last 59 years.
