- 18) although small lunette windows enhance the gable ends. These lunette windows have radiating stone voussnoirs. Other features include a small Victorian entrance porch, stone chimney, standing seam metal roof, and six-over-six windows.

Complex consists of round smokehouse, bank barn, stone chickenhouse, and various frame buildings. The smokehouse is structurally unsound and in danger of collapsing. Bank barn has impressive stone foundation with large six-over-six windows and wood lintels. Small frame house and outbuildings contribute to the importance of this complex. A worn flagstone walk runs from the house to a well near the barn.


