Significance (cont.)

Shanklin. Bethel Baptist Church was organized in 1816, and by the 1840s there was a movement to formally establish a town, which in 1847 was surveyed. By 1900 the town reached its zenith and even had its own newspaper, the <u>Fairview Review</u> edited by W. B. Brewer. Today, two houses are associated with noted townsmen Ch-56, the Vaugh House, the home of leading Fairview merchants, and Ch-58, the home of Dr. Stuart, president of the Bank of Hopkinsville and benefactory of the Jennie Stuart hospital.

The Vaughn House holds an important visual location in the town. Its long facade, with unusually widely spaced bays and a three part front porch, is a visual as well as historical landmark in Fairview. The left two bays are the front of the original log house. The Dr. Edward S. Stuart House consists of a two-story, three-bay, side passage plan frame house added to an earlier story-and-a-half Gothic Revival cottage, now the ell of the main block.
