Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The two story brick La Fave Block is sited on a corner and adjoins two brick buildings of similar size and design. The clipped corner entrance, with a triangular pediment, the two bay store front on the Cooper Avenue elevation and the cornice with large sawn brackets are the focal points of this Victorian Commercial style building. There is a secondary cornice with small brackets over the display windows between the first and second floors. (photo #18) There is another store front near the rear of the building on the Hunter Street elevation. While the front portion of the building is of brick, the rear part is frame with non-original windows and a two story open back porch. (photo #18a) The second story windows are tall, narrow and evenly spaced. They are one-over-one wood sash and have stone sills and brick label molds at the top. The corner triangular pediment, plainer in design but similar to the Aspen Block and the Brick Saloon, has the 1888 date of construction in relief across the face.

Beginning in the 1950s, the ravages of deterioration and vandalism were stopped and repaired. The most recent remodeling was in 1982 for the first floor occupant, Les Chefs D'Aspen. E. Brickham was the architect. · \.

The La Fave Block, constructed in 1888, is significant for its simple Victorian Commercial design which retains much of its original integrity. The building was built during Aspen's silver mining boom by Frank La Fave, one of Aspen's notable pioneers who built several commercial buildings between 1885 and 1889. The preservation of the street front is particularly notable.

BACKGROUND

Frank La Fave, the original owner of this business block appears to have left Aspen following the construction of this building. La Fave had wanted to construct a larger building, but the owner of the frame building next door to the west would not sell. In September of 1888, a fire destroyed that frame building. In 1892, that property was purchased by John Bowman, a saloon keeper, who built a two story brick building adjoining the La Fave Block. \perp

The La Fave Block is notable for its Victorian architecture similar to other Aspen commercial buildings of that period with large display windows, kickplates and clerestories, a clipped corner entrance with a triangular pediment at the roof line and a bracketed cornice.

One of the original occupants of the La Fave Block was the much touted St. James Restaurant. This "magnificent, neat and clean" establishment opened in the corner space late September, 1888. 2 Through the 1920s, the corner space continued to be occupied as a restaurant. The building deteriorated over time, but in the 1950s, The La Fave Block and the two adjoining brick buildings were bought by architect Fredric Benedict who made the corner restaurant space into his office. In 1955, Herbert Bayer, artist, architect and designer who was involved with Walter Paepcke in Aspen's post-war resort development, bought the La Fave Block. He later sold it to the present owner, famed skier Stein Eriksen. 2


