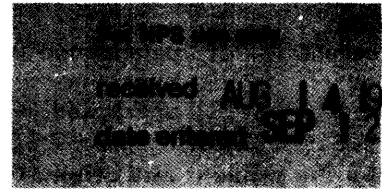

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Kelly's Hotel is a two-story hotel building of several frame or brick sections. While the building may have been erected in stages (an early photograph shows a completed frame section and the brick section under construction), it existed in its present form by September 1909, when it appears on a Sanborn Fire Insurance map for Gooding. The building has a square plan from an aerial view, but it gives the appearance of being deeper than it is wide from the street level, because the right one-third of the facade is a one-story frame section. The other two thirds of the building include, on the left, a two-bay brick section, and in the center, a three-bay frame section. The brick part of the building is constructed in common bond, with a header course interrupting the stringer courses every seventh row. The frame sections of the building are sided with narrow shiplap. The roof of the brick section is flat. The roof over the central frame section is gabled and has a false front on the street facade.

The building currently has a two-story frame porch attached to the central section that leaves the original front wall fully visible. The porch, erected in about 1981, replaced the original two-story frame porch (destroyed in an automobile accident) and approximates it in design and proportions. The hotel retains most of its two-over-one-light double-hung sash windows. In the brick section of the building these have segmental retaining arches above them. The transomed single-pane front doors are early, if not original, features. The brick section of the building features a denticulated cornice.

Statement of Significance (In one paragraph)

Kelly's Hotel is architecturally significant as one of the remaining early buildings in Gooding and as a relatively unaltered example of early frame and brick architecture as those constructions were used in small town buildings. Situated close to the Oregon Short Line tracks as they came through Gooding, the hotel undoubtedly served transient workers and railroad passengers, and it is a good example of the small establishments that were important temporary housing for newcomers to developing south Idaho communities during the first decade of the twentieth century.

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Architectural elements representative of small hotel architecture include the building's nearly unornamented brick section and its equally plain false-fronted frame section, both punctuated with series of double-hung sash windows. The building's small size and gable-fronted rectangular massing are also typical. Among the surviving commercial buildings of Gooding, this structure stands out as obviously early, because of its vague reference to the Renaissance Revival, and its use of frame construction; the other commercial buildings along Gooding's main street represent slightly later trends in style and more elaborate use of materials.

Built in about 1907 or 1908, Kelly's Hotel dates from the first years of the town of Gooding, which was platted in 1907 as a supply and shipping center for agricultural establishments in newly-established Gooding County and the sheep and cattle ranching areas there and farther north. The region was late to develop, and Gooding County was one of the later Idaho counties to be established, because much of the arid land there could not be utilized until Idaho's Minidoka Reclamation project created affordable irrigation networks. The first proprietor of the hotel, William B. Kelly, also had a livery stable in the town. He maintained the business until 1916, when a new proprietor took over. According to Buckway's local history of Gooding, Kelly's was the first hotel in the town and it provided housing for people who were coming into the new townsite. The hotel was so crowded during that time that tents were erected on the hotel grounds. Before his role as a Gooding townsite investor, Kelly had established a ranch nearby on the Little Wood River. By 1930, of the four hotels once operating in Gooding, Kelly's Hotel was the only survivor. The building continues today as an apartment building.

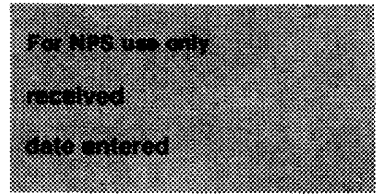
