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Description

The Dr. Robinson House is a one-and-one-half story, wood frame residence designed in a restrained version of the Folk Victorian style with distinct Colonial Revival influences. Its irregular plan revolves around the main, hipped roof core, and features two projecting, gable roof bays -- one to the northwest and the other to the southwest -- a shed roof front porch, and a screened, hipped-roof rear porch. A single brick chimney rises through the hipped roof toward the southwest. The asphalt shingle roof and wood weatherboarded walls rest upon a continuous, formed cast concrete block foundation.

The northwestern or front elevation consists of the projecting gable roof bay at the northeastern end and the recessed wall of the hipped section to the southwest. A single-leaf entrance accesses the wall beneath the shed roof front porch, which is itself supported upon two Classical wood columns. The columns are connected to each other and to the wood stair rail by a decorative, turned wood balustrade. Another entrance is found on the northwestern face of the projecting southwestern bay; two more entrances provide access to the screened rear porch. The fenestration consists primarily of one-over-one movable sash and single-pane fixed sash windows. Other features of note include the two doghouse dormers on the northwestern and northeastern elevations. The building features boxed cornices throughout and the back porch is supported upon a combination of turned wood posts and Classical columns. Minimal Classical details ornament the corner trim around the building.

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Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The Dr. Robinson House was constructed 1917-18 as a private residence on Walnut Street near downtown Leslie by an unknown builder for its original occupant, Dr. Robinson. Dr. Robinson was one of several local medical doctors in Leslie whose clientele consisted primarily of workers from both the Missouri and North Arkansas Railroad and the various timber-related industries that surrounded Leslie.

Its construction date of 1917-18 and its simplified Folk Victorian style with Colonial Revival influences represent the historic context Searcy County in the World War Era, 1910-1945: Economic Realignment, The Great Depression and World War. Though this was, generally speaking, a period of county-wide economic decline, some construction continued. With the long-standing presence of the railroad and the growing influence of the automobile, it was inevitable that new, national architectural styles would be reflected. As a particularly good example of this transitional style -- the earlier Folk Victorian idiom giving way to the newer Colonial Revival -- and the most intact example in the community of Leslie, the Dr. Robinson House is locally significant under Criterion C.
