Reviewer's Comments



Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of a line running parallel with the storm cellar's southern elevation and located 25 feet to the south thereof with a perpendicular line running parallel to the eastern elevation of the storm cellar and located 25 feet to the east thereof, proceed northerly along the latter line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the storm cellar's northern elevation; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the storm cellar's western elevation; thence proceed southerly for a distance of approximately 100 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel with the storm cellar's southern elevation; thence proceed easterly for a distance of approximately 100 feet along said line to the point of beginning.

Boundary Justification:

This resource was constructed as part of a larger farmstead that has lost its integrity as such; thus, this boundary includes all the property known to be historically associated with this resource.

This small outbuilding is conspicuously overbuild-with extremely nearly stone walls. This weight and the spreading wall profile would be appropriate to the function of storm color (assigned to it by oral tradition) and appears also to have been intended to create on aesthetic effect of strength a solidary.

Concerns roised in earlier return have been addressed.
