

The Walterboro Historic District, listed in the National Register on 10 November 1980, encompasses a large portion of the historic residential area within the town of Walterboro. The majority of the buildings in the district date from the early nineteenth century to the period just prior to World War II. Public buildings in the district include the Walterboro City Hall at 2422 Hampton Street, the Walterboro Water Tower on Memorial Avenue, several churches and the Hampton Street Elementary School at the corner of Hampton and South Miller Streets. The juxtaposition of churches and schools within residential areas is common and typical of the character of small Southern towns.

Walterboro High School, which is currently in use as the Walterboro branch campus of the University of South Carolina-Salkehatchie, is located at 807 Hampton Street. The school is a two-story, 28,000 square foot, masonry building with brick laid in common bond. The main block of the building reflects Baroque influence in its massing. A slightly protruding central bay defines the entry, which is flanked by brick pilasters and features an arcaded foyer. The end pavilions extend slightly from the plane of the main body of the building breaking the composition into three distinct elements. Windows, either single or grouped, establish a symmetrical balance for the fenestration. A cornice extends below a parapet shielding the flat roof from view.

A two-story classroom wing was added to the southeast elevation ca. 1935 and reflects the fenestration and materials of the original construction. The building was in use as a high school until the early 1980s.

Professional error led to the exclusion of the Walterboro High School from the Walterboro Historic District when the nomination was prepared in 1980. The school is significant both as an example of early twentieth-century trends in school designs and for its association with education in Walterboro since 1924.

Following the consolidation of schools in South Carolina in the early twentieth century, numerous large, well-planned modern school buildings appeared around the state in both rural and urban settings. A requirement for standardized designs for school architecture developed out of the passage of the school building act in 1910. Although smaller buildings were required to follow a set of prescribed plans, school districts were encouraged to use a registered architect for larger buildings.(1) Walterboro High School, one of the latter, was designed by architect James B. Urquhart of Columbia.(2) It was built by J.T. Dabbs of Columbia, who offered the low bid of \$53,300.(3) Work on the building, which began in January 1924, was to be completed in 175 days in order to be operational for classes at the beginning of the next school year and the Walterboro Press and Standard announced on 10 September 1924 that the new high school was ready for classes to begin in a few days.(4) The grounds encompassed seven acres and included many cedar trees which gave the area the name "Cedar Grove".(5)
