DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mason Valley Odd Fellows Building, erected between 1913 and 1914 is located on Main Street in Yerington, the Lyon County seat. It is situated among structures of similar age, close to the Courthouse and city park. While lacking certain decorative details on the exterior, the building nonetheless retains a high degree of integrity. Its original uses included commercial on the lower floor and Lodge functions on the upper. Current uses include commercial, bus depot, business offices on the upper floor, and a ballroom. It was designed by noted Nevada architect Frederick J. Delongchamps.

It is located in Section 15, T13N, R25E, M.D.B.& M., Lot 2, Block 3 Assessors page #01-19. The front of the building faces Main Street. Side entrances to the bus depot and upper floor offices are located on the Van Ness Avenue elevation. It is further situated on the same block as the Lyon County Courthouse, also a DeLongchamp design and listed on the National Register.

The foundation and walls of the 60 x 120 foot long building are of poured concrete. The east (front) facade and north facade are faced with brick laid in American Bond. Walls are generally flat and visual textural effects are provided by string courses and a minimal parapet decoration. Extant metal supports indicate that a sheet metal cornice once appeared on the east and north elevations. Additionally, evidence on the lower floor walls indicate that either a porch or canopy also appeared on the east and north elevations. No photographic evidence exists todocument these features. With the exception of the door hardware, the storefronts on the east elevation are original. Window configurations on the second floor are primarily one/one sliding sash in simple frames with arched, brick lintels. On the north elevation, multi-paned windows are the dominant treatment. The shed addition housing the depot is not original but no date is known. The roof is flat with asphalt covering.

Original interior organization was comprised of two large interior spaces servicing the storefronts. The second story, reached by a stair on Van Ness, leads to the ballroom. Additional stairs lead to the third floor, which originally housed the banquet room and kitchen. This space has been renovated into office space. All interior wood finishes are intact, although some of the original plumbing fixtures have been removed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The I.O.O.F. Building, Mason Valley, is significant on several counts. One, it figures prominently in the development of the City of Yerington; two, it represents a type of building that is rarely found intact in Nevada; and three, it was designed by noted Nevada architect Frederick J. DeLonchamps. Contexts used in the evaluation of this resource include: Architecture of Frederick J. DeLongchamps; Development of Yerington as the Lyon County seat; Fraternal groups and their role in community development in the United States.

In March, 1913, subscriptions were solicited for the erection of the Mason Valley Odd Fellows Building. The site, close to the recently completed Courthouse, was donated and plans were conceived for a 20-25000, two story structure to house commercial functions on the lower floor and various Lodge functions on the second. The Odd Fellows, characteristically, even offered the use of their facilities to other fraternal groups (Masons & Knights of Pythias). This building was to become the earliest community-oriented structure in Yerington, which after 1910, had become the Lyon County seat. After the transfer of the seat, the city grew rapidly and the necessity of this type of building became increasingly evident. It is typical of the Odd Fellow organization that they responded to the need. Their philanthropic activities in the areas of education and the care of orphans and widows in the late 19th and early 20th cenutries are well documented.

In December, 1913, the cornerstone was laid. Many persons of importance to the I.O.O.F. traveled from various parts of the United States to attend this event. Completed in 1914, the building played an important part in the growth of the city of Yerington, having served both business and social needs.

While surely one of his most modest designs, it is obvious that Frederick DeLongchamps skilled design sense is in evidence. Neatly divided into bays, the building would have presented a balanced, yet dignified appearance with its decorative elements intact. It is probable that he wished to have th building complement his recently completed, Classicallyinspired Courthouse. As the state's most prodigious and prestigious architect, DeLongchamps left an enduring legacy of simple yet competently designed buildings which contribute highly to the historic built environment in Nevada. Educated in Reno and apprenticed in SanFrancisco, DeLongchamps had a remarkably prolific career , having designed a preponderance of public buildings in Nevada. He was the only officially designated "state architect" and has been much honored by his peers.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

Beginning at the NE corner of Block 3 of the Barton Addition to the City of Yerington, and at a point 30 feet west and 1433 feet north from the SE corner of Section 15, T13N, R25E M.D.B.& M. Said point of beginning being further described as the intersection of the west line of Main Street and the South line of Van Ness Avenue; thence southerly 60 feet; thence at right angles west 120 feet to the east line of an alley running through the center of said Block 3; thence northerly along the east line of said alley 60 feet tothe south line of Van Ness Avenue; then easterly along this south line a distance of 120 to the place of beginning.
