Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Logia Másonica Hijos de la Luz of Yauco is detached, stuccoed, masonry, institutional structure set in the center of a large lot within the historic urban center of Yauco. The overall volume of the building is that of a horizontal one-storey rectangular pavillion.

The structure's roof is of timber and corrugated sheet-metal, hidden from view by the cornice and parapet.

The volume is divided into three sections at its main facade on Avenida José C. Barbosa. A three-bay slightly projecting central section is, in turn, sub-divided into three sections as well, consisting of a large, wide, central arched entrance door and narrower, though equally high, arched side windows. The three units are defined by rusticated pilasters which support a cornice that encircles the entire building. Above the cornice, the projecting 3-bay central section is capped by a simple, classical pediment which displays the lodge's masonic symbol within the tympanum. Each of these openings is articulated with a simple, yet elegant moulded surrounds.

The central doorway contains heavy, 2-leaf, panelled doors, and flanking entrances contain wooden jalousie shutters. The single bays flanking the central pedimented section are simply articulated in the neoclassical vocabulary of the nineteenth century. These consist of wide, planar, surrounds with narrow architraves. Above the cornice at these side units, and all around the structure, runs a solid continous parapet which is interrupted only at the pedimented main volume.

Each of the lateral facades of the independent structure consists of a rigid sequence of three rectangular bays identical to those at the sides divisions of the main facade.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Logia Másonica Hijos de la Luz de Yauco (The Masonic Lodge) is significant typology, its privileged setting, and its rigid & refined proportions. Built in 1894 by master builder Jesús Emmanuelli and designed by a French architect named André Troublard, the lodge was conceived as a major landmark on the wide, tree-lined avenue that linked the "Plaza Mayor" with the Yauco Railway Station.

Although architect-designed, the building follows closely the design characteristics of the civil structures built by the Royal Corps of Engineers during Spanish reign. The building portrays an excellent example of how the civil architecture of the Spanish Province carried over into the private-institutional sphere. The neoclassical articulation presents an image of authority and sobriety appropriate for the lodge's social position, at a time in which French influenced ornamentation was in vogue. The lodge's location within a large, open lot within urban setting, its pavillion typology, its placement upon a podium, its raised terrace and its austere classical articulation distinguish this building as a landmark of Yauco. In essence, the lodge is a small architectural gem, placed within a showcase-setting along the city's main avenue.

This early date qualifies Yauco's lodge one of the earliest in Puerto Rico if not the earliest. Since most masonic lodges were founded in Puerto Rico during the XX century after the United States's acquisition of the island in 1898.

The structure sits on a podium with a large, front terrace, accessed by a wide central stair of formal character. The terrace and stairs are defined by a concrete balustrade which begins at the newel post of the stairs and continues up and around the terrace on both sides.

This composition sits within the large lot, which is itself fenced off by a high balustered concrete fence with intermittent masonry posts.

The interior main space or temple is divided into three bays by a series of arches, one at each of opposites ends. Decorative original thrones, marble and stucco statues, wall-paintings and masoir artifacts remain within the building. Of particular note are the light bulbs with filaments in the shape the masonic emblem.


