

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Eyota Creamery is located in a residential area on the east side of the rural community of Eyota. Constructed of reinforced concrete and red brick, the creamery consists of a central two story east-west rectangle, 78 feet by 42 feet, with a 5foot projecting bay to the south. The wall of this bay, along with the central bay walls of the east and north sides, are carried through the second story into parapeted gables with raised concrete coping. The central rectangle has a hipped roof with stamped metal ventilators. A 20-foot-wide porte cochere, with triple arcade columns and parapet with concrete name and date panels, extends 14 feet to the south. There is brick quoining at all corners. Fenestration consists of three-overthree double-hung sash in tall rectangular openings which, at the first story level, have triple-light transoms, above which are centered decorative concrete panels. Window arrangement in the second story gables suggests a Palladian configuration. The main doorway is tall and round-arched. A recent 60-foot by 18-foot one-story brick garage stands to the north, connected to the creamery by a small passageway, and constitutes the only intrusion. The front door has been replaced and two front windows contain brick infill. Otherwise the creamery retains virtually complete exterior design integrity. Production ceased in 1977; some creamery machinery remains inside.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Eyota Creamery is significant as a well-preserved representative of the rural cooperative dairy industry of Olmsted County. The building is constructed on an unusually self-conscious architectural design. In terms of industrial and dairy history, the creamery represents the transitional era during the first half of the twentieth century when butter manufacturing, along with other dairy processes, was undergoing modernization and a scientific updating of technique. Thus new modern buildings were constructed to house the modernized processes and equipment. This also was a time of active cooperative rural dairy organizations, before the industry became dominated by giant urban corporations and cooperatives. Architecturally, the building represents what has been termed the Eclectic Resurgence or Period Revival, when it was fashionable to build in a variety of earlier styles. The Eyota Creamery design incorporates primarily classical motifs, such as the porte cochere arcade, corner quoining, Palladian windows, and general symmetry of plan. Unusually elaborate for a rural industrial structure, the creamery is a local architectural and industrial landmark.
