

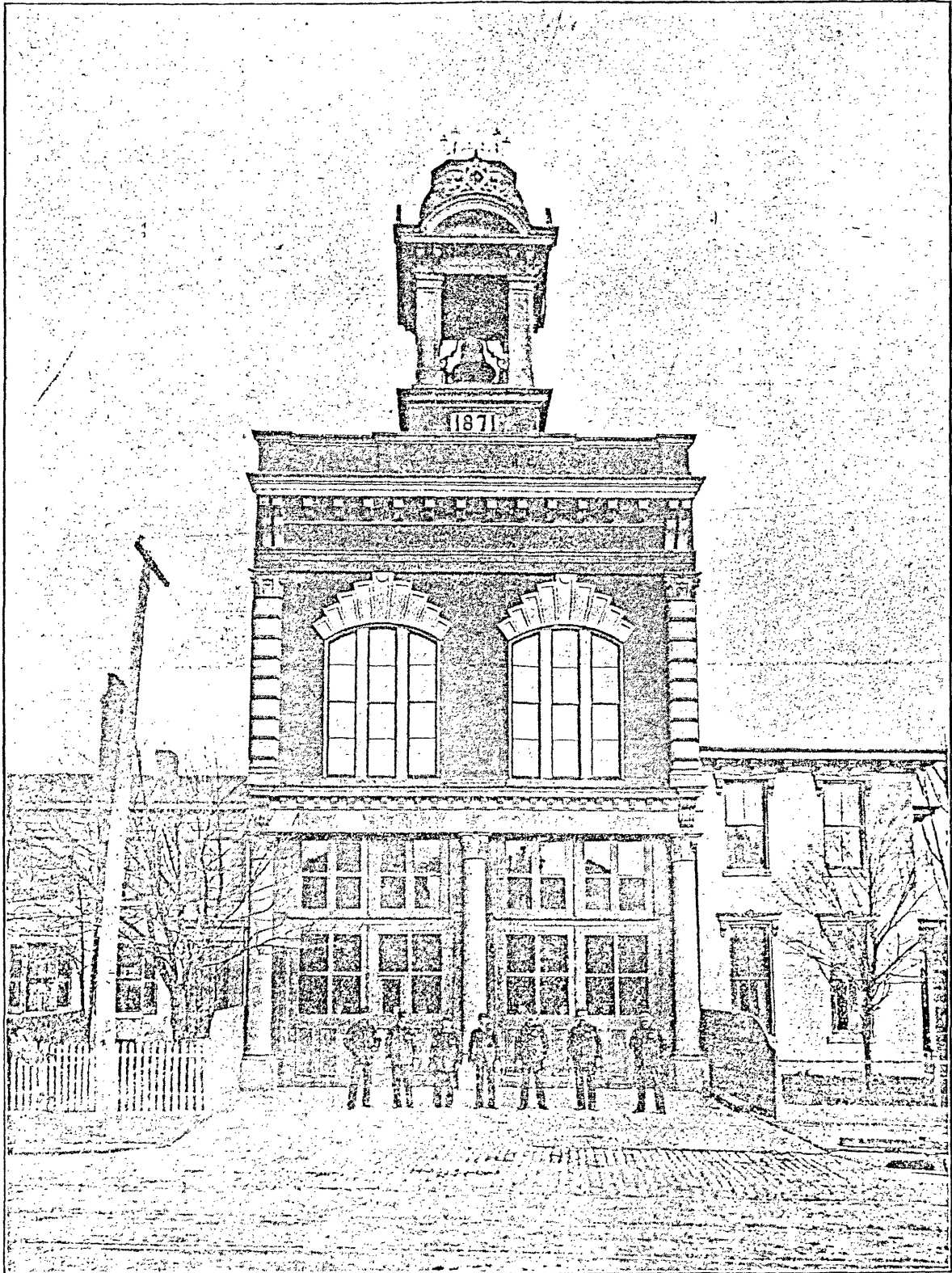

18. Description Engine House #7 is a two-story brick structure. The first floor still retains its double fire door openings but three large engaged Corinthian columns are no longer extant. Above the first floor is a small cornice band with modillions and large end brackets. The second story has two dramatic windows, each window consists of three narrow vertical panels and are surmounted with oversized stone voussoirs. (over)		36. Date 4/7/80	
19. History This structure is a handsome example of a utilitarian public building. It is stylistically related to the brick Victorian structures of Old Louisville and Limerick.		37. Revision Dates 38. Staff Review	
20. Significance Engine House No. 7 is significant as an excellent example of the Victorian style used in public buildings. The scale, building materials and architectural details relate the structure to the residential units built in the Limerick area.		39. _____

18. The corners of the second floor are articulated with pilasters made of rusticated blocks surmounted with Corinthian capitals. The capitals visually support several rows of raised brick banding. Above the banding is an extended cornice with paired end brackets and modillions. This is capped by a parapet.
