

Physical Description

The 1929 design for this romantic house, located in a serene, wooded setting, is based upon the then-popular Tudor Revival style. Rather than through ornamentation, the picturesque effects and deliberately rambling appearance of the large two-story house are achieved through the verticality and asymmetrical massing of its components. The lines of the steep gable end roof are broken by a projecting cross gable entrance section and by a prominent Jacobean-like chimney with clustered stacks accenting the front elevation. A slightly lower and somewhat recessed wing extends to the east, and on the west end of the house a second-story oriel-like overhanging window appears. Further asymmetry is provided by the varied sizes and arrangements of the casement windows, particularly evident in the off-center placement of the door and windows in the entry block. The handsome solid oak door with three small leaded glass windows is recessed within a plain segmental brick arch with a keystone. A medieval style pendant adorns the peak of the cross gable. The monochromatic earth tones of the house complete the effect of a country house. Constructed in Flemish bond, the terra-cotta colored bricks correspond to the tones of the tile roof and the dark brown trim causes the casement windows to blend in unobtrusively.

Statement of Significance

The Tudor Revival-influenced Moore House was built in 1929 in one of Little Rock's oldest and most exclusive and attractive suburbs, Pulaski Heights. The design, by the Thompson, Sanders and Ginocchio firm reflects their ability to translate the public's taste for romantic revival styles in the post World War I period to houses of dignity, charm and functional arrangement. Through the use of dramatic, asymmetrical massing, fine craftsmanship and a handsomely landscaped wooded setting, this large, dignified house is memorable even in an area of huge and sometimes ostentatious houses.
