Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Trinity Protestant Episcopal Church is located on U.S. Highway 14 in the village of Stockton, Minnesota. The Carpenter Gothic style church, constructed in 1859, is one storey, measuring approximately 25 X 42 feet. The exterior of the building is clad in board and batten pierced by narrow lancet windows with diamond pane lights. Entry is through the three tiered bell tower which is topped by a 45 foot metal spire. A simple gable roof with pierced bargeboard caps the structure.

In 1924, a full limestone basement was constructed on the present site and the church building was moved from the northwest corner of the lot. A small pentagonal shape chancel with paired art glass windows was also added on the north end of the building.

The church was greatly enlarged in 1971 by the addition of a new wing. The new portion, measuring 34 X 43 feet, joins the original building at the northwest corner, forming an ell shape plan. The addition shares design characteristics with the earlier building by the use of board and batten and lancet windows, creating a uniform visual image.

The interior of the church was greatly altered during a 1956 renovation, resulting in the loss of most original interior features. Only the wooden truss ceiling appears original.

Alterations to the 1859 structure include the replacement of the original transom and wood plank double doors with wood doors set with glass lights and leaded glass transom, and the infulling of the lancet openings with wooden louvers at the second and third tiers of the bell tower.

The building is in excellent condition and the well integrated 1971 edition has not diminished its architectural integrity.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Trinity Protestant Episcopal Church is significant for the survival integrity of its Carpenter Gothic architectural style and for its importance as a cohesive element in the settlement of the small community which it serves. The church was constructed in 1859, only four years after the first settler arrived in the Stockton area. The parish, formed in 1858, consisted primarily of Anglo-Saxon immigrants who had migrated from the East coast. By 1869, the ethnic composition of the small community had begun to change with German immigrants replacing the earlier group. The difficulty of ministering to a bi-lingual community resulted in the loss of a permanent rector and, by 1872, membership declined and regular services were discontinued. Grace Evangelical Lutheran congregation was formed in 1891 by the community's German settlers. The following year the new congregation obtained the church building, and it continues to serve the parish today. The small Carpenter Gothic style church with its board and batten exterior, diamond light lancet windows and finely proportioned spire is one of the most sophisticated examples of its type remaining in the area.
