#### **Narrative Description**

The proposed Cleveland Founders Historic District is composed of 317 buildings and one structure (water lift station), which lie west of Jones Bayou and the downtown commercial area of Cleveland, Bolivar County, Mississippi. The district includes mostly residential structures with a few scattered religious buildings, a county health clinic, and some limited commercial development along Court Street and South Pearman Avenue. The character of the district is that of an early subdivision of a small town with larger earlier homes built for the prosperous leaders or "founders" of Cleveland to later more modest sized homes and duplexes built for middle income families and housing for the Delta Teachers College opened in 1925.

There is only one building in the proposed Cleveland Founders Historic District that has been previously listed on the National Register. Adath Israel Temple at 201 South Bolivar Avenue was listed on the National Register in 2002.

In 1901 development started to occur west of the Jones Bayou with the construction of the new Bolivar County Courthouse. New residential areas started to develop around the courthouse with additional subdivision of land. This new area and subsequent subdivision of land further west, south, and north are part of the proposed Cleveland Founders Historic District.

The composition of the Cleveland Founders Historic District is that of a typical north-south, eastwest street grid pattern of land subdivided for residential building in the early 1900s. The eastern boundary of the district is Jones Bayou and the boundary of the Downtown Cleveland National Register District which includes the Bolivar County Courthouse. There are four streets in the district that run in a north-south direction and include Pearman Avenue, Bolivar Avenue, Leflore Avenue, and Victoria Avenue going from east to west. All of those streets have a North and South distinction with Court Street being the division of the North and South portion of the streets. Running from south to north there are seven blocks in the district. The western boundary of the district is actually the eastern half of the blocks which lie between Victoria Avenue and First Avenue. There are seven streets going in the east-west direction that intersect with the north-south streets. From south to north they include Roby Street, College Street, Lamar Street, Shelby Street, South Court Street, North Court Street (North and South Court Streets are actually two separate streets that run parallel to one another), and Francis Street. Running from east to west there are three full blocks and two half-blocks in the district. The southern boundary of the district is bounded by Avery Street and the northern boundary of the district is bounded by Sunflower Road also known as State Highway 8.

The grid pattern to the streets in the district is not regular as the blocks closer to the courthouse are smaller and those north and south are more than double in size. Within those blocks there seems to be a regular lot size to each block with some blocks closer to the courthouse having larger size lots and those farther away having smaller lot sizes. This gives a very regular pattern to the houses. The streetscape is also enhanced by very similar setbacks with most houses sitting fairly close to the streets with only some of the larger houses sitting further back on the lot. Some of the blocks are occupied by churches which consume several lots and there are also a few instances where houses are located on more than one lot like the houses in the 400 block of South Bolivar Avenue. Like most of the Delta area of the state the topography of the district is relatively flat. Most of the lots in the district have a degree of casual landscaping and there are numerous old growth trees throughout the district.

There is very little commercial development in the district with only a small commercial area along Court Street and a small area along South Pearman Avenue which is mostly composed of houses converted to offices and relatively new offices constructed to look like houses.

Several important religious structures in the district were built during the period of significance. They are the First Baptist Church located at 101 North Bolivar Avenue built between 1947 and 1949 (#1), First Methodist Church at 318 South Court Street constructed in 1917 (#66a) in the Neoclassical style, the 1928 Calvary Episcopal Church constructed in the Craftsman style which was relocated to its current location when a new modern Calvary Episcopal Church was constructed in 1956 at 409 South Court Street (#69), the Adath Israel Temple at 201 South Bolivar Avenue built in the Byzantine style between 1926 and 1927 (#22), and the Iglesia Marailloso Salvador Southern Baptist Church which was a former Craftsman style residence converted to a church in the 1930s (#18).

There are no historic schools in the district and there appears that none were built by looking at Sanborn maps of Cleveland. Two schools (Graded and Consolidated) appear on the 1933 Sanborn Map of Cleveland just north of the northern boundary of the district on Sunflower Road. In 1925 Delta Teachers' College was opened only four-and-a-half blocks from the western boundary of the district and helped to spur construction of houses in the western portion of the district and outside of the district near the college.

Most of the resources in the district are representative of residential development typical in Mississippi for the time. They vary in size, style, and construction dates from large two-story

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homes, to more modest one-story homes, to small cottages, and even duplexes. There is no one area of the district that has the larger more impressive homes, however there are several two-story homes near the courthouse on North Leflore Avenue and several spread out along South Bolivar and on South Pearman Avenue. Major architectural styles represented in Cleveland are those of the early-to-mid 20<sup>th</sup> century although some of the early buildings use designs more typical of the late 19<sup>th</sup> century. Residential styles of architecture include: Queen Anne, Folk Victorian, Colonial Revival, Craftsman, Tudor Revival, Minimal Traditional, Ranch, and International.

Residential development in the district began closest to the Bolivar County Courthouse when it was completed in 1901 and spread south, west, and north as additional land was subdivided for residential development. Only 10% of the resources in the district remain from the earliest period of development from 1901 to 1910. Of those resources that remain from that period they tend to have the characteristics of the Queen Anne style although some exhibit a transition to the Colonial Revival style. Due to Cleveland's location on a rail line they were able to take advantage of the production techniques of the "Industrial Age" that produced standardized house parts used in the construction of Queen Anne style houses such as machine-made siding, structural lumber, and decorative details such as turned columns, balustrades, frieze work, and decorative trim. South Bolivar Avenue has several early one-story examples of houses in the Queen Anne style including 204 (#25), 208 (#27), 210 (#28) and 212 (#30) all built around 1905. The house at 212 has extremely high integrity. Examples of the less detailed and simpler massed one-story houses in the Folk Victorian style can be found at 305 South Bolivar Avenue (#38a), c.1910 and a brick version at 101 North Victoria Avenue (#175a), c. 1905. Some surviving twostory versions of the Folk Victorian include 214 South Bolivar Avenue (#29) built c. 1901, and 306 South Bolivar Avenue (#39a) built c. 1905. Houses that started to make the transition from Queen Anne to Colonial Revival include the one-story house at 206 South Bolivar Avenue (#26) built c. 1905, 400 South Bolivar Avenue (#51) built c. 1905 also one-story, and the two-story E. J. Nott house at 301 South Bolivar Avenue (#34) constructed c. 1905.

As styles transitioned from Queen Anne to Colonial Revival the Colonial Revival style became very popular for several large important two-story houses constructed between 1910 and 1920. Some of those houses include 408 South Bolivar Avenue (#055) built c. 1912, 200 South Pearman Avenue (#184) built by E.T. Clark ca. 1910, the C.R. Smith house at 208 South Pearman Avenue (#189) constructed ca. 1915, and the W.A. Hardee house at 106 South Pearman Avenue (#181) constructed in 1919. All but the house on South Bolivar Avenue were constructed of brick indicating the wealth of the builders and the desire for "upscale" early 20<sup>th</sup>

century homes. In the district the identifying features of Colonial Revival houses were: medium to low-pitched roofs over (mostly) symmetrically-massed buildings with classical exterior details.

The Craftsman style became very popular in Cleveland most likely due to the availability of materials via the railroad and a move to a simpler, more restrained style from the previous highly decorative Queen Anne homes and the classical Colonial Revival homes. The Craftsman homes constructed in the district were much more modest than previous homes with simplified massing, low-pitched roofs with open eaves and exposed rafters, decorative knee braces in gable ends, gable-front or other porches including matching porte cocheres, low porch walls, and masonry piers with simple wood boxed columns. They were scattered throughout the district although there is a concentration of them in the 300 block of South Bolivar Avenue and in the 200 block of North Leflore Avenue. The most outstanding example in the district of the Craftsman style is the Samuel Rufus "Toots" Davis house at 500 South Leflore Avenue (#168) built by Davis in 1917. Several other good examples of the Craftsman style include the c. 1920 house at 109 North Victoria Avenue (#208), 311 South Bolivar Avenue (#45) built c. 1925, 115 North Leflore Avenue (#77) built c. 1925, and the c. 1920 house at 211 North Leflore Avenue (#87a). The district also has several examples of simple Craftsman style duplexes including 218-220 North Leflore Avenue (#92) constructed c. 1940, 224-226 North Leflore Avenue (#94) constructed c. 1933, and 315-317 South Bolivar Avenue (#49) built c. 1930. Having been proponents of the earlier 20<sup>th</sup> century Colonial Revival style, Clevelanders were apparently reluctant to give up its simplicity and its classical details as some homes were built with classical details superimposed on homes with Craftsman massing and materials. The Bedwell House, built c.1930 at 200 South Leflore Avenue (#128), has a hipped roof and Craftsman windows combined with a classical entry complete with broken pediment and reeded pilasters. Another example of combined Colonial and Craftsman detail is the Graham house at 205 North Bolivar Avenue (#2) constructed c. 1933. There is also a duplex with a mix of details consisting of Craftsman massing and highly-detailed chinoiserie woodwork on the twin porches at 108-110 North Victoria (#207) built c. 1930.

The Tudor Revival style was not a very popular one in Cleveland. There are only a few examples of the style although there are several houses in a hybrid style with the use of Tudor Revival components. Some examples of the Tudor Revival style in the district are 214 South Leflore Avenue (#107a) built c. 1940, 212 North Leflore Avenue (#88) built c. 1940, and the c. 1930 house at 207 North Victoria Avenue (#198a). A couple of examples of houses using the

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Tudor Revival mixed with the Craftsman style mixed can be found at 410 South Court Street (#68) built c. 1927, and 213-215 North Victoria Avenue (#203) built C. 1945.

Just before World War II a new style called Minimal Traditional emerged combining elements of earlier styles. The new houses also started to incorporate garages as part of the structure instead of relegating them to outbuildings or using a porte cochere for vehicles. The new Minimal Traditional style favored smaller type cottages embellished with Colonial Revival details, and used simple side-gabled, cross-gabled or hipped roofs. Also incorporated were multi-paned windows with applied shutters. A number of these houses were constructed in the 200 to 400 blocks of South Victoria Avenue. Several good examples of the style all built around 1940 are located at 205 South Pearman Avenue (#158), 218 South Victoria Avenue (#221), and 300 South Victoria (#224).

The boom of housing construction after World War II used the Minimal Traditional style but also started using the Ranch style featuring more streamlined and horizontally massed houses with less classical detail. A transitional style Ranch style house using classical details and Ranch massing is the Homer Sledge, Sr. house at 315 South Leflore Avenue (#156) constructed in 1952. Other typical Ranch style houses are found at 217 South Victoria Avenue (#220) built c. 1955, 305 South Victoria Avenue (#228) built c. 1950, and 308 South Victoria Avenue (#230a) built c. 1955.

There is one International style house in the district built c. 1950 at 315 South Victoria Avenue (#263). The house is rectangularly-massed, has a two-level flat roof, and such materials of modern design as ribbon windows, sheet siding, and a poured concrete foundation.

Throughout the district some of the houses have been sided in vinyl or aluminum siding and some of the original windows have been replaced with new modern windows mostly of metal. Several residential structures with front porches have been modified with new columns and removal of decorative features. The vast majority of non-contributing elements in the district are new construction after the period of significance and include houses and multi-family buildings scattered throughout the district. The non-contributing elements that were built during the period of significance are houses that have been heavily altered and no longer retain their historic integrity.

#### **Bolivar Avenue, North**

1947 - 1949

Two-story brick church with three-story educational wing built between 1947 and 1949. The entrance to the church is under the four-story bell tower with the sanctuary to the right (north) and the U shaped educational wing to the left (south). The entrance features ten-light paired French doors with an arched fan light transom within a door surround of cast stone pilasters holding up a projecting architrave and pediment. Above the entrance door is a six-light paired casement window with a nine-light circular window above that with four cast stone keys. The bell tower is capped with a copper turret. The sanctuary portion of the church features four wood arched stained tri-partite glass windows on a cast concrete sill with the central section a 16/16 double-hung sash. Between each window is a brick pilaster with a cast stone capitol and base. Above the pilasters is a cast stone cornice line with a large wood paneled area above to the roof line. Below the windows is a water table line of cast stone and below shuttered basement windows. Projecting gable end bay has one tri-partite matching stained glass window with cast stone cross in gable. The curvilinear apse has projecting round wood Doric columns on cast stone bases with two levels of stained glass windows in between. The first level features 4/4 wood double-hung sash and the second level a six-light wood casement window. The threestory educational wing to the left (south) of the bell tower has a central entrance with modern double leaf glass store front doors on the first level with cast stone pilaster and pediment surround. On the first two floors the windows are wood 6/6 double-hung sash and on the third floor are six-light paired casement windows. To the rear of the sanctuary is a 1967 three-story brick building addition with a one-story porte cochere with Doric columns. Windows are 6/6 wood double-hung sash on the first two floors and nine-light casement windows on the third floor. All windows have cast stone sills and cast stone corner lintel blocks. The roofs are flat on the wings and gabled on the sanctuary covered in composite shingles.

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33. NC 214B Bolivar Avenue, South 1979

One-plus-story frame, rectangularly-massed Masonite sided studio on concrete slab foundation has butted shed-roofed sections of One-story (L) and one-and-a-half story, with a rectangular, shed-roofed storage area attached at the northeastern corner. The northern and taller shed-roofed section has plexi-glass siding over the studs above the lower roof for illumination. Other windows are six-light fixed and one-light without surrounds. Door is salvaged one-light in wood, with one-light transom and side-lights. Roof is composition shingles.

34. NC 221-223 Bolivar Avenue, South 1995

Two-story, semi-detached, brick veneered condo units on concrete slab foundations have side-gabled roofs of composition shingles with brick pediment separators. Second floor has three sets of narrow French doors with operable shutters on each unit. Street level fenestration is obscured at left behind a two-car-garage with a mansard roof. Unit at right is three-bay (W, D, Bay). Ornamental-iron-work balustrades and brackets support upper balconies, lower porches.

35. NC 225 Bolivar Avenue, South 1995

Part one-story, part two-story condominium on concrete slab foundation, rectangularly-massed with brick veneer exterior. One-story wing to left (N) has four sets of narrow, multi-light French doors (the set to the right has flanking multi-light side-lights). A massive brick-veneered chimney is located on the west plane of the roof. The right side has a two-story section with an upper balcony having three sets of French doors. The street level facade on the two-story section and wing is four-bay (D paired, D French, D French, W). Recessed entry has paired, leaded-glass wood doors. Other fenestration is two sets of French doors with side-lights and a set of casement windows. Roof is composition shingles.

36. C 300 Bolivar Avenue, South 1911
One-and-a-half story frame, side-gabled, multiple-gabled vinyl sided house on brick foundation, rectangularly-

Full width porch becomes a porte cochere on right (S), is supported on wood Tuscan columns, has replacement brick porch floor and steps, brick walk. On south elevation, porte cochere has Tuscan columns on short brick piers, a Sun Room/Sleeping Porch with multiple 1/1 double-hung sash windows on second level. House was built by E. L. Nott, early Cleveland civic leader and lumber yard owner. House originally had a wrap around porch with a corner entry. Roof is composition shingles.

37 b. NC Garage c. 1980

One-story frame, side-gabled Dutch-lap sided storage shed with shed-roofed extension for carport on slim Tuscan columns.

38. C 302 Bolivar Avenue, South c. 1950

One-story frame, rectangular, side-gabled asbestos shingled house on brick foundation with rear ell on southwest has three-bay facade (W. D. W.). Windows are 6/6 double-bung sash in plain frames with an

41 a. NC 307 Bolivar Avenue, South c. 1910 One-story frame, former Folk Victorian aluminum sided house on brick foundation and remodeled beyond recognition. Door is new single leaf metal and glass storm with two-light side windows. Former porch is enclosed. Brick steps land on brick walk. NC 500 College Street c. 1960 Ranch One-story brick veneered hipped roof house on brick foundation with six-bay façade (W, W tripled, D, W paired, W, W). Hipped roof entry porch supported by brick columns. Windows are 2/2 horizontal metal frame with brick window sills. The wood front door has three decorative panels. The two car garage is on the west end of the house with openings facing South Victoria Avenue.

#### Court Street, North

62. NC 304 Court Street, North c. 1980

One-story frame, side-gabled brick veneer sided house on brick foundation with three-bay façade (W paired, D, W paired) on main mass. Wing has two windows to the left. Side-gabled carport on decorative metal posts to the right. Gable ends of the house are covered with vinyl and have louvered vents at the peaks. Roof is composition shingles.

#### Court Street, South

63. NC 205 Court Street, South c. 1960

One-story, rectangular, brick-veneered commercial building on concrete slab foundation, former office to west of Dedwylder Clinic has three-bay facade (Plate Glass, Door with Plate Glass Side-lights, Plate Glass) recessed on north elevation. Flat roof with overhang is wood-faced. Openings are framed with square, hollow, dividing "columns" with plank caps and bases. Door is hollow core. Side windows are two-light sliders.

64. C 219 Court Street, South c. 1950 Cleveland Service Station

One-story, flat-roofed, rectangularly-massed former service station on concrete slab foundation still has three garage bays to left, now filled with modern metal and glass windows, a massive brick dividing wall between the garage area and former office (Plate Glass, D, Plate Glass). Walls are concrete block, partially wrapped in metal siding. Flat-roofed shelter over pumps is supported on metal poles. Pumps and tanks removed. Concrete drive-through and parking area. Replaced earlier service station on the lot.

65. NC 311 Court Street, South c. 1980

One-story, rectangular, "drive-through" branch bank building on concrete slab foundation with brick veneer exterior. Facade bay has three glass sides and front, has curving roof with a glazed door and plate glass windows. Windows are anodized aluminum. Concrete stoop and walk from main entrance. Metal shelter supported on metal posts and brick walls are attached at each side of building and cover the drive-through area.

Neoclassical

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66 a. C 318 Court Street, South 1917
First Methodist Church

Two-and-a-half story brick, rectangularly-massed religious building on brick foundation has central, pedimented portico on main mass, two-story brick Education Building recessed at right (east). The portico is supported by fluted Corinthian columns, three circular windows in the frieze, pediment has dentils and a rectangular diamond paned window. Three tall arched stained glass windows under portico with double-leaf wood doors and arched transoms on the recessed walls. First floor windows consist of paired stained glass wood double-hung sash units with arched transoms. Second floor features paired stained glass wood double-hung sash units with diamond pane transoms. Two-story brick wing with partial visible basement to the right (east) of the main church. Windows are paired wood double-hung sash units. Roof is asphalt. [Photo # 4]

66 b. NC Education Building c. 1965

One and two-story brick and stucco education building on brick foundation for First Methodist Church facing North Leflore Avenue. One-story wing is mostly plate glass windows and double leaf glazed store front doors. Two-story portion has alternating bays of protruding solid brick walls and recessed window walls with fixed two-part vertical windows on both floors with rough stucco panels metal frames. Roof is composite shingles.

67. NC 401 Court Street, South 1961 Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library

One-story, hip-and-gable-roofed, rectangular, brick-veneered public library building on concrete slab foundation has four major bays (Plate Glass, Concrete Block wall, D, Plate Glass). Plates are large, have metal frames. Double leaf glazed entry doors with glass side-lights and transom. Decorative concrete blocks form quatrefoil designs on facade. Flat-roofed central section joins front section to side-gabled rear section.

68 a. C 410 Court Street, South c. 1927 Tudor/Craftsman Elmer Nowell House

One-story brick, multiple-gable-roofed Tudor/Craftsman mix house on concrete foundation has nine-bay facade (Porte Cochere, W tripled, W, Round-Arched entry, W, W tripled, W, W tripled). Windows are Craftsman-style 6/1 double-hung sash in wood frames, have concrete lintels and edgings of brick headers. Entry porch is asymmetrical gable with round-arched opening and round-arched door and screen. Stoop and steps are tiled. Walk is brick. Front gable on sun room to left is skirted, pedimented over expanded Tudor arch with three single light windows, aluminum mullions. All gable ends are rough-stuccoed. Front-facing chimney at right of entry gable has twin stacks with round-arched detail between. Porte cochere to west has square, hollow brick columns, low brick wall, concrete capitals and balusters, rough-stuccoed gable with six-light window. Roof is architectural composition shingles.

68 b. C Garage c. 1940

Brick two-car garage in matching Tudor/Craftsman detail to northeast of house.

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69 a. C 409 Court Street, South 1956 Calvary Episcopal Church (modern)

One-story-plus, front-gabled, brick-veneered "T"-shaped Modern church on concrete slab foundation has concrete pointed arch projecting around the central entry doors. A full-length, stained glass window abuts the arch at each side. Windows are modern, attenuated, protected behind clear outer pane. Double door entry has paneled, molded wood doors in concrete, arched surround with molded detail. Two concrete steps lead to front and side walkways. Side and rear elevations also have protected stained glass memorial windows. Roof is composition shingles.

69 b. C Calvary Episcopal Church (historic) 1928 Craftsman
One-story frame, gable-front Craftsman style stucco church on concrete foundation has enclosed gable-front
porch, three-bay facade (W, D, W). Windows are 10/1 double-hung sash wood, Craftsman style, in frames
with drip cap. Current door is new six-panel, insulated single leaf in surround with three-light side-lights.
Porch is enclosed, has concrete steps, metal railings. Original gable ends have curving fascia boards with
cornice molding, molding trim at eaves. Side-gabled wing at rear of old sanctuary connects with secondary
front-gabled section. Its facade, also facing west, is one-bay (D). Door is single leaf wood, "plank" with
round window having divided lights under gable-front roof shelter on wood brackets. Diamond pattern
asbestos roof shingles. The church was moved to its current location when the new modern sanctuary was
built.

70 a. C 501 Court Street, South c. 1910 Craftsman Wakefield/Dakin House

One-story-plus frame, brick-veneered, rectangularly-massed house on brick foundation with sun porch ell to west, is hip-roofed with asphalt shingles, has centered, hip-roofed dormers with exposed rafter tips on three sides and paired nine light windows, extensive wrap-around screened porch on northern facade and part of eastern elevation. Facade behind porch is four-bay (W, D, W, Sun Room). Original windows are Craftsman multiple lights/one in wood frames, have brick lintels. Entry door not visible. Hip-roofed wrap porch is supported on half-length, battered, square wood columns landing on brick piers. Porch is entirely screened, with entrances from South Leflore Avenue and South Court Street. Two interior brick chimneys survive. Roof is composition shingles.

70 b. NC Garage c. 1980 One-story, gable-front, two-car vinyl sided garage. Composition shingle roof.

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#### **Lamar Street**

71 a. NC 201 Lamar Street

c. 1975

Two-story, hip-roofed, rectangularly-massed apartment block on concrete slab foundation has brick-veneered facade on north, but entrances on west, facing parking lot. Facade is three-bay up and down (W, W, Stairs). Windows are 6/6 double-hung sash aluminum with no frames, over wood panels, and have applied decorative shutters. Concrete stairs have decorative metal railing. Hipped roof of composite shingles has boxed eaves. Doors are six-panel, insulted, single leaf, new. [Photo # 5]

71 b. NC Apartment

c. 1975

One-story frame, brick veneered rectangularly-massed, side-gabled apartment on brick foundation with composition roof shingles.

72. C 203-205 Lamar Street c. 1931 Craftsman/Bungalow
One-story frame, hip-roofed asbestos shingle sided bungalow duplex on a brick foundation has front-gabled
porch across two centered entry bays. Facade is four-bay (W, D, D, W). Windows are 6/1 double-hung sash
wood in frames with drip cap. Doors are single leaf wood, with six rectangular lights/panels. Gable-front
porch has layered fascia, narrow frieze, square hollow porch posts with molded caps, no bases. Porch floor is
wood, steps concrete. Roof is composite shingles.

73. NC 312 Lamar Street

c. 1970 Ranch

One-story, side-gabled, rectangular, brick-veneered modern house on concrete slab foundation has one-story wing recessed to rear (E), one-story garage attached at rear (NW). Facade is six-bay (W, W, W, D, W, W). Right window is in wing. All are 8/8 double-hung sash wood, have brick lintels. Of the five bays on the main facade, the central three are recessed under a shed-roofed extension of the main side gable. Porch is supported on square posts with molded capitals. Door is six-panel single leaf wood in surround with heavy hood molding, has three concrete steps to concrete porch floor, walk. Roof is composite shingles.

#### Leflore Avenue, North

74. C 107 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1945

One-and-a-half-story frame, vinyl-covered gable-front house on brick foundation with few identifying features. Facade is five bay (Carport, W tripled, W tripled, D, W tripled). Windows are 6/1 double-hung sash wood, surrounds covered. Door is single leaf wood, faux plank with strap hinges. Entry shelter is open gable-front feature supported on wood brackets. Brick steps lead from door to walk. Carport is supported on reeded metal posts. Roof is composite shingles.

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75. C 109 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1930 Craftsman
Two-story frame, rectangular Craftsman novelty board sided house on brick foundation with multiple hippedroofs of composite shingles has a four-bay facade (Porte Cochere, D, W, W paired). Windows are large 6/1
double-hung sash wood with drip cap, decorative shutters. Door is single leaf wood with leaded lights. Porte
cochere and porch are supported on 1/3-length boxed, square, hollow columns landing on square brick piers.
Other than porte cochere, porch is screened in, has wood tongue-and-groove floor and brick steps. Upper
facade has two sets of paired 6/1 double-hung sash wood windows. Hip-roofed dormers on north and south
elevations have louvered wood vents.

76. C 111 Leflore Avenue, North 1912 Colonial Revival Edward B. Hill/Napoleon LePoint Cassibry House

Two-and-a-half story, rectangularly-massed, frame Colonial Revival house on brick foundation is hip-roofed, with full-width hip-roofed porch, hip-roofed dormers, glass-enclosed porch section to left (S) of entry. Ground floor facade is now two-bay (W multiple, D). Original windows are wide 1/1 double-hung sash wood. Door is one-light-in wood, with one-light side-lights over beveled aprons, has separate transom. Porch is enclosed with rank of seven 1/1 double-hung sash windows, has secondary door from porch into sun room. Entry is under pedimented gable supported on paired square brick columns. Gable has heavily-molded frieze. Porch floor and steps are concrete. Upper facade has two wide 1/1 windows in plain wood frames with operable shutters flanking two rectangular stained glass windows with a central panel between. Hip-roofed dormers are centered on all visible roof planes. Eaves are boxed, flared, have curving modillions. One exterior chimney survives on north elevation. First level is brick-veneered, second has rough stucco coating. Roof is composite shingles.

77. C 115 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1925 Craftsman/Bungalow One-story frame, side-gabled weatherboard sided Craftsman-Bungalow house on brick foundation with front-gabled porch has revised five-bay facade (French Door, D, French Door, W, W). Windows are 9/1 double-hung sash wood in frames with drip cap. French doors are new, wood and glass. Single leaf door is multilight, with beveled glass panes in wood. Front-gabled Craftsman porch has knee braces in gable, wide frieze, square, hollow paneled, half-length columns and low wood wall. Porch floor is wood, steps concrete. Roof is composite shingles.

78. NC 117 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1960 One-story frame, side-gabled house on concrete slab foundation has three-bay facade (W paired, D, W tripled) Windows are 2/2 horizontal double-hung sash wood in plain frames. Door is six-panel, single leaf wood with two upper lights. Shallow porch shelter extending from right (N) 2/3 of facade is supported on wood Tuscan columns. Brick veneer skirt under shingled upper section. Roof is composite shingles.

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79. NC 200 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1970

One-story frame house on concrete foundation with a combination of board and batten siding and brick veneer has one hip-roofed section parallel to street, two more sections perpendicular to street toward rear. Only the facade is visible, the remainder appears to be built around courtyard. Facade has carport to left (N), recessed entry on northwest corner, then two windows. Rest of facade is behind fence around perimeter of property. One bay is visible on the facade, one on the south elevation. Roof is standing seam metal.

- 80. NC 203 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1975 Ranch One-story frame, side-gabled, brick-veneered Ranch house on concrete slab foundation has carport to left (S) with decorative pierced brick wall. Facade is four-bays (W, W paired, D, W). Windows are 2/2 horizontal double-hung sash aluminum. Door is single leaf, six-panel wood. Shed-roofed extension over two windows and entry door is supported on decorative metal posts. Roof is composite shingles.
- 81. NC 205 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1970 Ranch One-story frame, brick-veneered, side-gabled Ranch on a concrete slab foundation, rectangularly-massed, has four-bay facade (W paired, D, W, W). Windows are 2/2 horizontal double-hung sash aluminum with no surrounds, brick lintels. Door is single leaf, six-panel wood. Shed-roofed extension forms shallow front porch, is supported on wood Tuscan columns. Porch floor and walk are concrete. Roof is composite shingles.
- 82. C 206 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1945 Craftsman/Colonial Revival Terry House

One-story frame, side-gabled weatherboard sided Craftsman house on brick foundation has front-gabled porch to right (S) of four-bay facade (W, W, D, W). Windows to left are double-hung sash wood with hood molding. Door is not visible behind decorative storm. Right windows are six-part, Ranch style metal replacements. Front-gabled porch has knee braces, wide, molded frieze, wood Tuscan columns landing on brick porch, brick steps. Porch gable end has small 6/1 double-hung sash wood window. Garage with exposed rafter tips attached to rear of house. Roof is composite shingles.

83 a. C 207 Leflore Avenue, North c. 1910 Folk Victorian Billy Pleasants' House

One-story frame, rectangularly-massed, gable-on-hip-roofed Folk Victorian weatherboard sided house on brick foundation has double gables and shed-roofed porch on three-bay facade (W paired, D, W). Paired windows are new, anodized aluminum and glass. Door is single leaf wood – faux plank. Wide Victorian window to right (N) has diamond-and-arrow leaded lights. All windows have decorative applied shutters. Porch has wood floor, reeded metal replacement columns, brick steps, and walk. Roof is composite shingles.

Front gable over entry has been carved out, made into living space with a facade wall of one-light windows. Gable is pedimented, has square, brick porch supports, brick floor and steps, brick walk. 158. C 205 Pearman Avenue, South c. 1940 Minimal Traditional One-story frame, multi-gable-roofed weatherboard sided house on brick foundation with colonial details has four-bay facade (W, D, W tripled, W paired). Windows are 6/6 and 4/4 double-hung sash wood in plain frames, have drip cap. Door is recycled Italianate single leaf in surround with classical broken pediment with urn finial. Stoop and steps are concrete. House corners are marked by reeded pilasters with molded capitals and necks. Tripled window is three-part, with a central 6/6 window flanked by 4/4 windows. Roof of composite shingles has boxed eaves, molded cornice.

159. NC 207 Pearman Avenue, South c. 2005
One-and-a-half-story frame, side-gabled house on brick foundation. Siding is Dutch Lap composite boards.
The first floor has a five-bay façade (W, W, D, W, W). The windows are 12/12 metal frame with window hoods and applied decorative board shutters. The entry door is a salvaged Queen Anne style door with a large glass light over one panel. The porch is integral and is supported by square wood columns with a balustrade of wood square rails. The porch floor is wood. There are three gable-front dormers with 6/6 metal windows. A one-story wing is to the right (S) for the garage. The roof is architectural shingles.

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160. C 208 Pearman Avenue, South c. 1915 Colonial Revival C.R. Smith House

Large, highly-detailed brick Colonial Revival early 20<sup>th</sup>-century house on brick foundation has clay tile hipped roof with dormers. Facade is three bay both upstairs and down: first floor is W, D, W; second floor is W, W paired, W. A pedimented, gable-front dormer with applied plaster decorative detail, heavily-molded classical pilasters with lonic capitals at the corners and rectangular louvered wood vents is centered on the facade above the entry door and upstairs paired windows. The clay tile roof with clay ridge tile and finials also has gabled dormers on all other elevations. Roof eaves are boxed and have closely-spaced modillions above a molded frieze. The frieze forms the "hoods" of the upstairs windows. Windows are wide,12/1 double-hung sash wood in mitred wood frames. Entry door is one beveled light in wood, single leaf, in surround with side-lights and separate transom. The hip-roofed, one-story porch has a projecting, pedimented entry gable with applied plaster details, a heavily molded frieze, and paired and single, reeded Ionic wood columns which land on the concrete porch floor. Steps and walk are concrete. Low brick wall with concrete coping and capitals edges front walk, outlines edges of front yard. [Photo # 11]

is elevated, has concrete steps to concrete walk. Entry is in ell of projecting front-hipped section to right.
Remainder of facade is slightly recessed. Roof is composite shingles.

C 515 Victoria Avenue, South c. 1930 Side-gabled, one-story frame weatherboard sided house on brick foundation with side-gabled carport at left (N), has four-bay facade (W, W paired, D, W paired). Windows are 1/1 double-hung sash wood in frames with drip cap. Door is Craftsman single leaf wood with round-arched, six-light window over brackets and panel. Gable-front entry shelter is supported on New Orleans style metal iron work (carport also,) and has concrete stoop, steps, and walk. House is rectangular with side-gabled ells on both ends, side-gabled carport.

259. C 518 - 520 Victoria Avenue, South c. 1950 Minimal Traditional Rectangular, hip-roofed, one-story asbestos shingle sided duplex on brick foundation at southwest end of South Victoria Street has eight-bay facade (W, D, W, W tripled, D, W, W). Windows are 8/8 double-hung sash wood in frames with drip cap, blank panels under windows, decorative shutters. Doors are single leaf, one-lights over cross panels. Entry porches are hip-roofed, supported on square boxed columns with molded hood, plank bases. Stoops, steps, and walks are concrete. Tripled window in right (N) apartment is 4/4 double-hung sash windows flanking a 8/8 double-hung sash window. The door surround has reeded pilasters. Roof is composite shingles.

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#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

#### **Summary**

The Cleveland Founders Historic District, located in Cleveland, Mississippi, represents an example of residential development in the early twentieth century on subdivided land outside of the commercial center to accommodate the growth of a small rural town. The district has a rich tapestry of building styles, sizes, and construction dates, all which give the district a unique pattern of development and character. The Cleveland Founders Historic District is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places for significance under criteria A in the area of community planning and development, and criteria C in the area of architecture. The period of significance is from 1901, the date the land in the district was opened for development, to 1957, fifty years prior to this nomination. The district's significance also derives from a concentration of intact residential, religious, governmental, and commercial resources illustrating not only the popular architectural styles of the period between 1901 and 1957, but also vernacular forms common at the time.

The history of the Cleveland Founders Historic District is closely tied to the history of the development of downtown Cleveland. Although the area in the district does not include the homes of Moses Coleman, the first settler in the area, or W. L. Pearman, the owner of much of the land west of Jones Bayou, the area does help define the course of development by offering built proof of the eras in which the town expanded and the styles that were current in those eras.

### **Town Founding to 1901**

The area that was to become Cleveland was first settled on the east side of Jones Bayou. One of the first homes, which no longer survives, was that of Moses Coleman who constructed a house near the east side of the bayou in 1869. Another early settler was W.L. Pearman who settled in the area after marrying in 1874. W.L. Pearman purchased land around Jones Bayou during the

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years before the railroad arrived.<sup>2</sup> The Pearmans outgrew their first home and built their second home in 1884 which still stands today on the street that bears his name.<sup>3</sup> The development of the newly settled area was spurred by the construction of the Louisville, New Orleans, and Texas Railroad through the Delta area of Mississippi and completed in 1884.<sup>4</sup> The railroad brought commerce to the area necessitating the construction of a commercial center to support the new businesses developing. In 1885 eight blocks east of Jones Bayou were subdivided and a new depot was constructed to serve the railroad. On March 25, 1886, the town was incorporated as Cleveland named after the 22<sup>nd</sup> President of the United States.<sup>5</sup> Ideally situated halfway between Memphis and Vicksburg, Cleveland attracted numerous entrepreneurs which spurred commercial development around the railroad. In 1896 W.L. Pearman subdivided his holdings east of the railroad on all sides of the 1885 plat. One of the problems encountered by the growing community of businessmen was the accessibility of the County Courthouse located several miles away in Rosedale. To solve this problem Cleveland businessmen lobbied for a courthouse in Cleveland and W.L. Pearman even offered a portion of his former farm for the courthouse square. Because of these efforts it was decided that Cleveland would become the second county seat of Bolivar County in 1899. With a population of 479 in 1900 plans were underway to construct a new courthouse.<sup>7</sup>

#### Early Expansion of Cleveland West of Jones Bayou

The year 1901 marked the beginning of the expansion of Cleveland west of Jones Bayou. With the donation of land west of Jones Bayou for the new county courthouse by W.L. Pearman construction was underway. In 1901 the new courthouse was completed on a square bordered by North Court Street, South Court Street, Pearman Avenue and Bolivar Avenue. W.L. Pearman also subdivided additional land for residential development around the courthouse including lots along Pearman, Bolivar, and Leflore Avenues. When the original courthouse was completed in 1901, the building of new homes in its neighborhood was already underway.

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The area of the Cleveland Founder's Historic District closest to the downtown is South Pearman and North and South Bolivar streets near Jones Bayou. Not coincidentally, this is also the area where several of the earliest and most substantial 20<sup>th</sup> century houses were built. On South Pearman are the large Colonial Revival homes built by E.T. Clark (200, #154), C.R. Smith (208, #160), and the house of W. A. Hardee (106, #151a). These are all examples of Cleveland's "upscale" early 20<sup>th</sup> century homes. Homes of architectural and historical importance on North Bolivar include the Graham house at 205 (#2) and Wiggins house at 215 (#12a), both Colonial Revival in style. Several of the homes on the west side of South Bolivar are commodious Victorian-era houses. Names associated with these early Cleveland homes include: H.M. Laudig (200, #21a), Dr. William Townsend, (202, (#23), Yance Ray (204, #25), Dr. E.R. McLean (206, #26), Harry M. Ward (212, #30), and E.J. Nott (301, #36a). The homes themselves indicate a preference on the part of city founders and early civic leaders for current styles and the new, machine made-materials that were shipped by rail to Cleveland.<sup>8</sup>

During the first three decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, when many neighborhood resources were built, housing styles moved steadily away from ornate Victorian architectural details and toward simpler and more streamlined styles. This evolution of styles toward the types of buildings common today is more visible in Cleveland's residential architecture than in its commercial buildings. This is due in part to a number of major fires in downtown Cleveland in 1901, 1908, and 1921 which eliminated examples of early commercial styles.

Cleveland's early days were devoted largely to the development of railroad and timber-oriented businesses. In almost all cases, the early surviving homes in the district are solid, somewhat simplified examples of vernacular versions of popular styles. Many of these homes may be versions of home plans available in a variety of the newly developed house-plan books, or of magazines which became more available with regular mail delivery by train.

By the "teens" of the 20<sup>th</sup> century professionals such as merchants who served the railroads and timber industry, the attorneys, and the timber entrepreneurs, had the capital and the inclination to hire professional help when they planned and built their new homes. Examples in the district are the highly-detailed C.R. Smith House at 208 South Pearman Avenue (#160), almost certainly designed by an architect and the W.H. Hardee house at 106 South Pearman Avenue (#151a), designed by the firm of Hanker and Cairns from Memphis."

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### Establishment of Delta State Teachers' College

The effect of the establishment of Delta Teachers' College (now Delta State University) was "the hot topic of the mid-Twenties and a major turning point in the history of Cleveland and the Mississippi Delta". This turning point is also recorded in the styles and numbers of residential buildings that were constructed from the mid-20th century onward in Cleveland's western neighborhoods. The Sanborn Insurance Maps from 1925 and 1933 show a "boom" in residential development, but much of it a different type from the large single family residences closer to the downtown area to more modest sized homes further away.

The "Cleveland" chapter of the <u>History of Bolivar County, MS</u> describes the change this way: "From 1920 to 1930, the number of public buildings, private business houses, and dwellings erected was more than double the number constructed in the previous decade; and through the 1930-40 period – including the years of the Depression – construction surpassed that of the previous period." In addition to outstanding single family homes, like the Elmer Nowell house at 410 South Court (#68a), the trend in residential construction was for duplexes. The lumber and construction companies of Ward & Nott Lumber Company, and Nowell Lumber Company were likely the primary builders of a limited number of styles of duplexes and smaller homes built all over the city from the 1920s into the 1940s. They used the popular Craftsman style, with its variants, for new construction in the district. Craftsman duplexes are documented on every major street in the district. Local historians indicate that some of them were built in the side or rear yards of the larger houses to accommodate family members. Others were undoubtedly built in vacant lots, or where earlier structures had been lost. They are evidence of the influx of students and teachers who would need temporary housing.

Probably the most interesting of Craftsman style homes for Cleveland's built history and in the district is the home of Samuel Rufus "Toots" Davis at 500 S. Leflore (#137a). Davis, a carpenter, arrived in Cleveland in 1912 with his family, possibly to work for Nott and Ward Lumber Company and "built homes and churches all over Cleveland." He built his own

Craftsman house about 1917, out on what was then the southern end of South Leflore Avenue. According to the 1930 phone book Davis listed himself as an "Architect." <sup>15</sup>

The boom in Cleveland's development had been almost continuous since the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. From its modest early numbers, Cleveland's population had grown to more than 900 in 1910, to 1,674 in 1920, and to 3,240 by 1930. <sup>16</sup> By the 1920s, Cleveland's city fathers and first business owners were aged or deceased and a new generation was taking the lead in town development. A substantial number of these new leaders moved into the city during the 1920s and 1930s. Although the Great Depression affected Cleveland, the town's connections with the Illinois Central Railroad, its agricultural base, and the new college, appears to have kept the city from great economic harm.

As in other cities throughout America, the New Deal programs of Franklin Roosevelt's administrations aided Cleveland in the construction of city streets and in water, sewer and drainage facilities that further aided the development of the city including the area in the district. In 1936 a bond issue for a new sewer system passed overwhelmingly.<sup>17</sup> One reminder of the city's water and sewer upgrading survives in the district. On Shelby Street, between South Leflore Avenue and South Victoria Avenue, a round, concrete "lift" station that helps deliver water to the western residential areas is still in service (#169).

#### World War II and Recovery

Cleveland sent most of its young men to war in the years 1940 to 1945. Almost a quarter of the 8000 men in Bolivar County who registered for the draft in October of 1940 were from Cleveland. Delta State University was greatly affected because almost all of the male students left for military duty. During the war years the city realized the need for further industrial development. The Cleveland Industrial Board printed a pamphlet called "Grow with the Industrial South," and proposed Cleveland as a prime location for new industry and a good provider of formerly agricultural labor. Apparently, a tug-of-war ensued between the interests of the merchants and farmers who had built Cleveland and the all-out industrial development forces.

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New businesses and new industries combined to keep Cleveland growing, so that by 1950 the town had 6,747 residents. 19

Just as the businesses and industries that located in Cleveland following the war were indicative of a new version of southern life – pharmaceutical companies, automobile related (and dependent) businesses, and power or communications suppliers – the homes built in the western area of the district were recognizable, but modern descendants of the earliest homes in town. Instead of being in separate buildings, or in attached but open porches adjacent to the house, garages became part of the main house structure, with doors directly into the house. The house styles themselves were more horizontal, more streamlined.

The Craftsman style was carried on into the mid-20th century for a few years but was replaced by the Minimal Traditional or Ranch style houses and other pared-down modern forms. Returning World War II veterans were offered government-backed loans to finish school, to start businesses, and to build homes. In the district, examples of these houses are most common to the west of earlier houses and closer to Delta State University. Houses that appear to have been built late in the war years or just after include a long swath of homes on South Victoria Street in an area known locally as "The Slough." With a few exceptions, the homes built on the west side of the street in the 200 and 300 blocks are the small frame Minimal Traditional cottages, Ranch style, or Modern style houses

Notable houses in the district from the World War II period and the post-war period of Cleveland's growth include: the Homer Sledge, Sr. "classically-detailed" Ranch house at 315 South Leflore (#125) and a Modern, flat-roofed house at 315 South Victoria Avenue (#236). The Sledge home was designed by Greenville architect Harold Kaplan for Homer Sledge, Sr., who brought the Nehi Bottling Company to Cleveland in the mid 1920s.<sup>20</sup>

Two resources in the district that have changed their functions help describe the changes that Cleveland has weathered since the middle of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The Iglesia Marailloso Salvador Southern Baptist Church at 105 South Bolivar Avenue (# 18) was a residence when it appeared on the 1925 Sanborn Insurance Map. By 1933, it was serving as the Christian Church. Perhaps the change was made necessary by Cleveland's growing population and the increasing diversity

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of its residents. The P. B. Woolard House, shown on the northwest corner of the intersection of Shelby and South Bolivar streets all during the Sanborn Insurance Map coverage of the neighborhood, was demolished in 1954 to allow the construction of Southern Bell Telephone Company's new "multi-million dollar headquarters" at 108 South Bolivar Avenue (#20).<sup>21</sup>

During the 1960s and 1970s newer homes in the Ranch style were built replacing earlier houses or on vacant lots throughout the district. During the 1970s and 1980s several apartment complexes were constructed most likely to handle the growing population of Cleveland and Delta State University. From the 1980s to the 2000s a few new homes were built in the district.

### Conclusion

The Cleveland Founder's Historic District represents a unique pattern of residential development as the town of Cleveland grew from a small railroad stop to a small city. The beginning of development in the district in 1901 began around the courthouse and spread out north, south, and east creating a residential environment with regular grid streets and a consistent pattern of houses of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Buildings of different styles of architecture from 1901 to the present survive, giving the district a unique mix of architecture from small cottages to grander two-story homes ranging in styles from Queen Anne to International. The Cleveland Founder's Historic District is certainly a unique residential community to Mississippi and one that visually expresses the growth of Cleveland over the years with its numerous significant historic structures surviving to this day.

### Amendment to Change Status from Noncontributing to Contributing

The Cleveland Founders Historic District, Bolivar County, Mississippi, was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on November 14, 2007. The Period of Significance for the district is 1901-1957. At the time of the original nomination, the property located at 311 College Street (No. 59 in the Inventory) was designated noncontributing based on an estimated construction date of 1960, outside the period of significance. Since that time the owner has provided tax records which establish that the house was constructed in 1954. The house is consistent with other contributing properties in the district based on architectural style, materials, massing, setback, landscaping and scale. Therefore the property should be considered CONTRIBUTING to the Cleveland Founders Historic District, Bolivar County, Mississippi.
