Wa-B-l. Consisting of a single span, camelback through truss with diagonals placed in both tension and compression, this railroad bridge is the only rail access into Bowling Green from the north across the Barren River. It is a symbol of the historic importance of the railroad to the county seat of Warren County. It is a good example of a popular truss type, it complements the two nearby highway bridges into Bowling Green, and it is a powerful visual focus of the riverscene.
