19. History (cont.)

The house was probably built by Garland Anderson who acquired the property from James Blair (Blane; Blain?) in 1819. Peter Anderson heired part of the property at Garland's death in 1829, and bought the remainder from his brother, Robert. Peter sold to Alford Anderson in 1852 and Alfred's children, Walter W. and Dollie Walford, heired according to his will. The original land grant was a 1000 acre survey to John Sanders and James Blair (Blane; blain?) purchased in 1805 from George Chamberlain of Norfolk, Va.

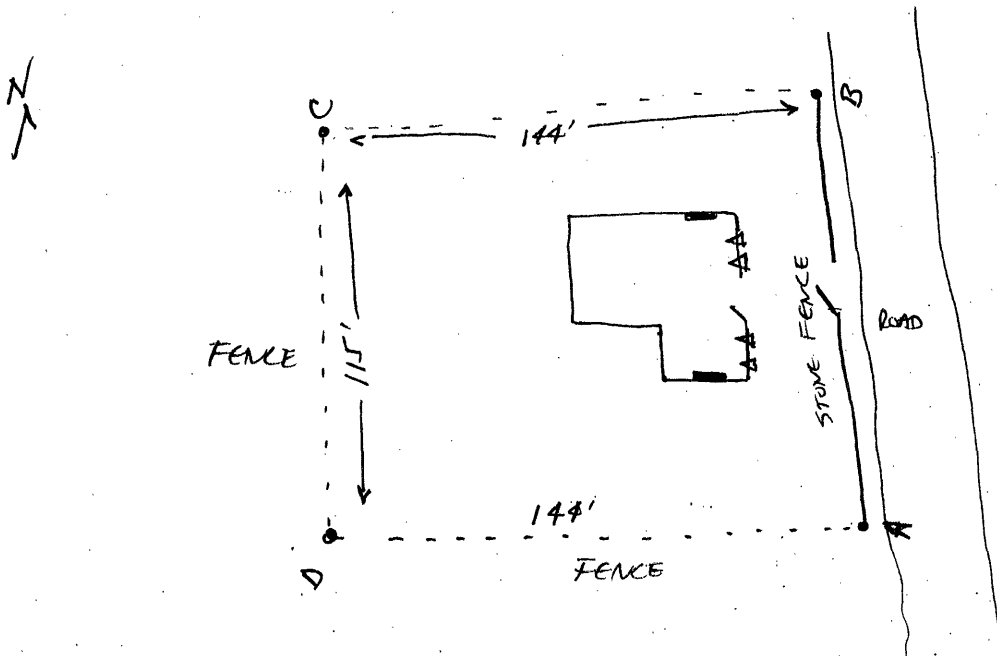
