13. Statement of Significance:
This property is significant under Criterion C as a well-preserved example of the late 19th C. (1865-1900) two-story, frame, center-passage, single-pile plan in Shelby Co. Only four such houses were identified from the period. This one is particularly noteworthy for its elaborate, Victorian moldings & trim found in the front porch, window surrounds, and cornice detail, [C]

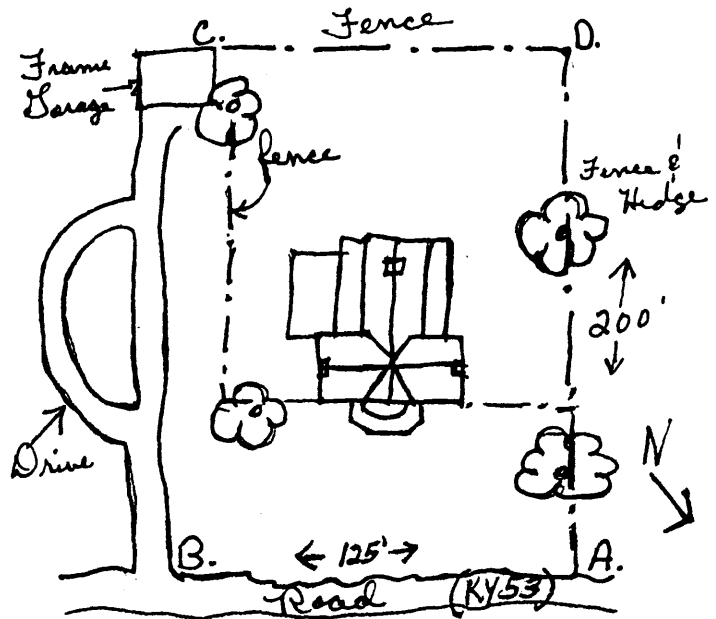

44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):

Beginning at A, which is located in the northern corner of the yard at the intersection of a fenceline with the west edge of KY 53 and is 66 feet north of the northern corner of the dwelling, southeast 125 feet along the west side of KY 53 to B; thence 200 feet southwest along the north side of the drive to C; thence 125 feet northwest along a fence to D; thence 200 feet along a fence and a row of hedges to the point of origin. The boundaries were chosen to include the house its domestic-related space defined by fences, a drive, and KY 53. There are no contributing outbuildings.

45. Description and House Plan: Exterior:

Two story, three-bay, frame, weatherboard, center-passage, single-pile plan, elaborate one-story, hip-roofed porch with turned posts and spindle work, pilaster strips frame front door, decorative wooden segmental-arched moldings above paired windows on first floor, molded trim around all windows on principal (northeast) facade, central, three-part oriole window in center bay of second floor with pilaster strips between windows and decorative cornice similar to that on all sides of main section of house, central, gabled pediment above oriole, all sash 1/1, gable roof, brick interior end chimneys with corbelled caps, narrow corner boards, brick foundation, two-story offset ell with enclosed (weatherboarded), one-story, shed-roofed porches on both the north and south sides. Ell may have been added, has modern window sash added.

There are no contributing outbuildings.
