
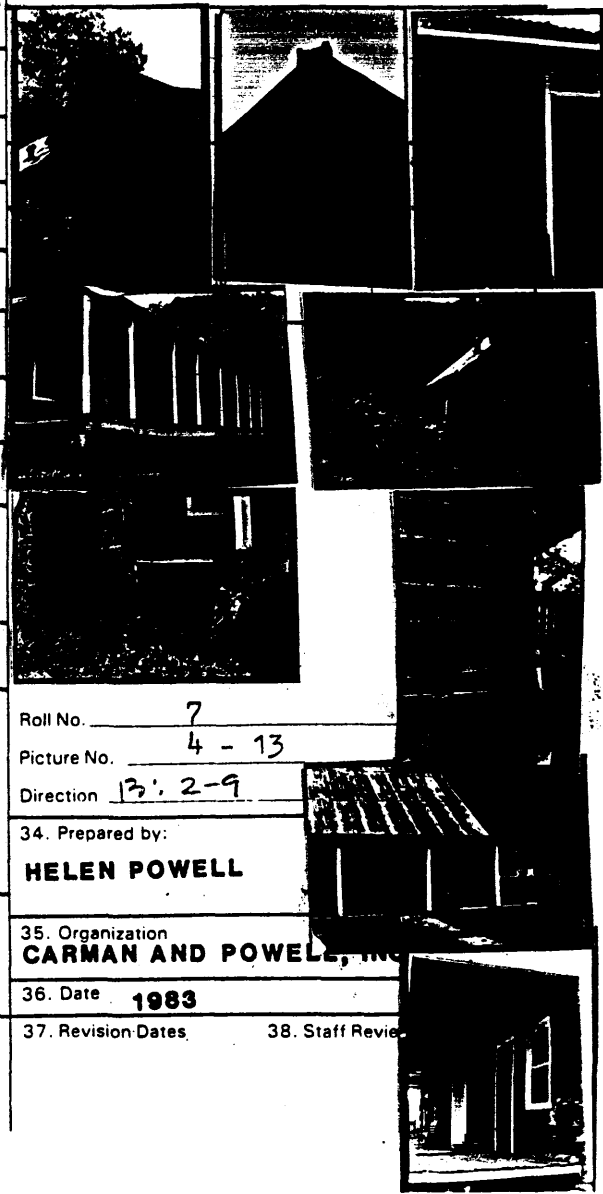

the corners of the house and mid-beam. The house is five bays on the front facade or window, door, stair, door, window. The stairway between the two pens is the access to the loft. There is a one-room ell which has been added to the rear facade of one of the pens. Most of the hewn-logs are visible. The sheet-rock covering to one end of the house is recent.

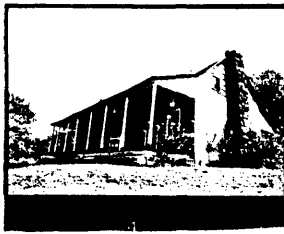

Verbal Boundary Description

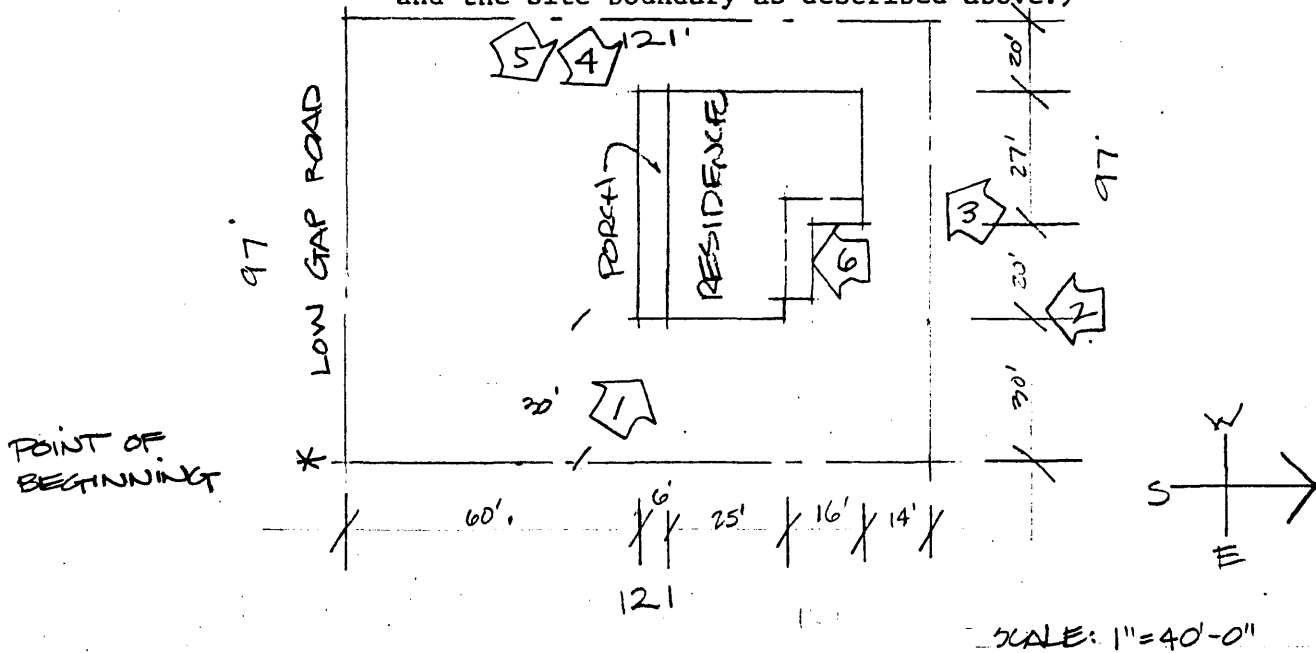
Acreage .30
