

SITING, BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION, AND RELATED STRUCTURES:

Situated on the southwest corner of Penn Street (0822-137) and Glover Street (0822-135), the Thompson House opens up onto Penn Street but the corner store built into the house faces both streets. An empty lot connected to the west of the house contains several interesting plantings and is bound by an old wrought iron fence.

SIGNIFICANCE:
Once known as Thompson's Grocery Store, an old sign in the window now advertises for the Gloucester County Electrical Company, although the store appears to be unoccupied. Thompson's Grocery Store is the only one like it in the Glover Historic District (0822-130) that remains today. A large portion of herringbone sidewalk also remains at the southwest corner of Penn Street (0822-137) and Glover Street (0822-135) and leads right up to the front doorstep of the store entrance. The style of the house itself is similar to a few of the houses on Penn Street (Neg. File # WD5-11 and Neg. File # WD5-14) with the exception of the rear addition, which is two stories high on the other houses while only one story on the Thompson House.
The best preserved late 19th century grocery store in Woodbury, Thompson's Grocery is an excellent survival of a traditional family-owned small business. Serving primarily the townspeopl of Woodbury's West End, Thompson's Grocery, although now closed, is associated with the town's independent entrepreneurs. Its prominent location at Glover and Penn Streets, helped establish this building as one of Woodbury's most important corner stores.
