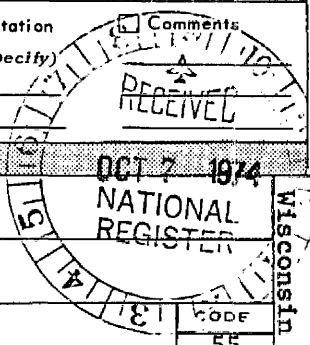

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hazelo-Healy house is a two-story structure with a one story wing. Constructed of fieldstone with a cobblestone veneer on its front facade only, it is in the Greek Revival mode, with symmetrically-placed windows, a gabled roof, broken denticulated pediments, and stone lintels, quoins, and date stone. The date stone bears the date 1858. The wing has an inset entry porch with Doric columns, and the windows have wooden sills almost two inches thick. The cobblestones used are of moderate size in light, earthy colors with a few reds and browns mixed in. These are set horizontally in a frame of "V" joints. The quoins are irregular and left rather rough; they are of local buff and gray dolomite. The walls of the house are of random ashlar dolomite ledge rock.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Jedediah Healy's family, which arrived in Racine County in 1841, was one of the earliest to settle in the area, and the Healy house is one of the few cobblestone houses to have been built for a family from New England rather than New York. Richard Perrin has called the Hazelo-Healy House "perhaps the most curious piece of cobblestone masonry in Wisconsin. . . .It is the unique treatment of the cobblestones that invites attention, since nothing quite like it has thus far been turned up anywhere else. The stones, of medium size and obviously taken from glacial till, are not particularly unusual, but each one is literally set in a frame. The horizontally and vertically joined "V" joints are of equal size and profile, thus giving each stone a niche of its own."<sup>1</sup>

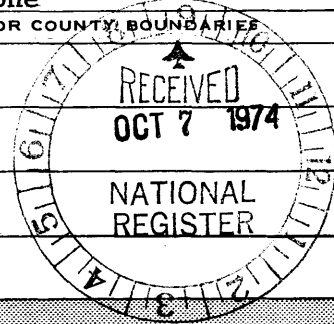
