The Brown House is a two-story brick, four bay residence with an original one-story brick ell. The house was built ca. 1840 and is the only known double pen brick residence in Larue County. The house is sited on a rural farmstead in the southeastern section of the county.

The house has a gable roof of asphalt shingles, a brick foundation, and two, interior wall chimneys. The main facade of the house is of Flemish bond construction while the side and rear facades are five-course common bond. At the cornice are two rows of corbelled brick. On the main facade is a ca. 1970 one-story frame porch with wrought iron posts. Doors were replaced ca. 1960. Windows have original jack arches and the four-overfour sash appear to have been added ca. 1890. Several windows have original shutters. In the ell of the rear facade is a one-story frame porch with added siding constructed ca. 1900.

The interior retains its double cell form with two similar sized rooms on the first floor. The interior has simple Greek Revival influenced mantles and four panel doors. At the rear of the house is a greatly remodeled ca. 1900 frame smokehouse and modern outbuildings.

## PROPERTY TYPE: Rural Residence, 1820-1860

The Brown house is significant under criterion C as a notable example of a brick residence of the ante-bellum period. The house was built ca. 1840 and despite additions, retains much of its original interior floor plan and character. The house is the only double cell brick residence known to exist in the county.

The Brown family was the original owner of the house but deed research has not been conclusive to determine which member had it erected. The house was built on in a fertile section of farmland adjacent to the Rolling Fork River near the community of Gleanings. The Brown family owned the house until the late 19th century when it passed into the hands of the T.J. Miller family. The Millers owned the house until it was sold in 1902 to James M. Meers who farmed the land into the 20th century. The house continues to be the center of a large farm by the present owners.

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

Verbal Boundary Description: The boundary for the Brown House is shown as part of lot 3 on Larue County tax map 70. The boundary for the house is a rectangle and is bounded on the east and south by a driveway, on the north by a fenceline, and on the west by a line which is located ten feet from the western facade of the house.


Verbal Boundary Justification: The boundary of the Brown House is drawn to include all unaltered buildings which are associated with the property's period of significance. Modern or altered outbuildings to the west are omitted from the boundary.
