



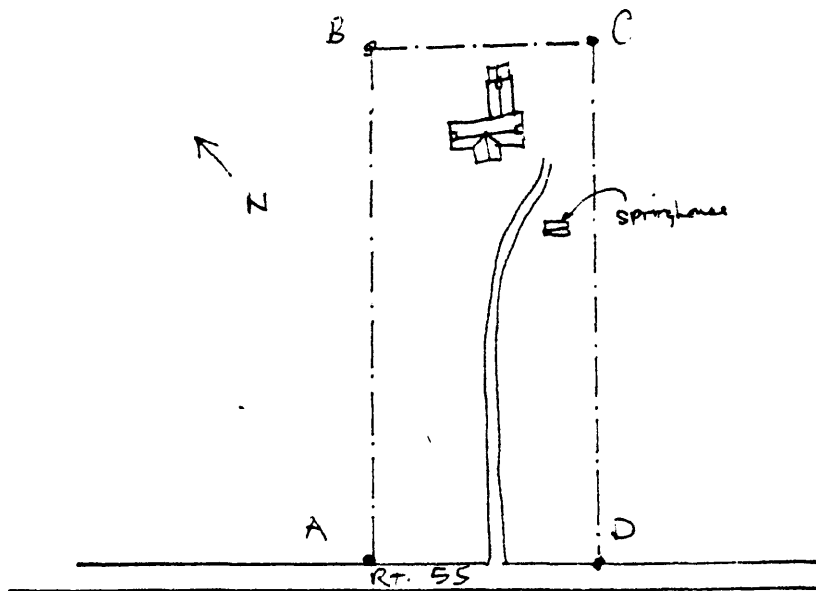

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage approx. 3 acres

Point A is located 100 feet southeast of the intersection of Rt. 55 and the Ray-Wakefield House drive on the northeast side of Route 55. Beginning at Point A on the east side of Ky. 55, northeast along a fence to the north of the house approximately 800 feet to Point B, thence 200 feet southeast with fence northeast of the house to Point C, southwest along a fence to the south of the house approximately 800 feet to Point D, northwest along east side of Ky. 55, 200 feet to the point of origin. The boundaries were drawn to include the house, lawn, and immediate domestic-related space as defined by fences and the highway. The nominated area includes two contributing buildings (the house and springhouse).
