18. Description <u>Three bay frame Gothic house distinguished by center gable and lancet style window. Side elevations have cornice returns and six-over-six windows. Front elevation has two-over-two lights on the first floor. Transom window over front door. Other details include small circular attic vents in the side gables and a later front porch. The roof is covered in ribbed metal. Foundation material is rubble limestone.</u> <span style="float:right">(Continue on Back)</span>			
19. History <u>In 1877 James W. Weldon owned this house. Weldon (1835-1904) was the son of James Weldon, who was listed in the 1870 Census, a 72 year old retired wheelright. In 1850 he was listed as a wagonmaker with real estate worth \$1,000.00. By 1884 W.T.Fields had acquired the property.</u>			
20. Significance <u>An unaltered example of Gothic vernacular architecture. Part of a group of three historic properties.</u>
