Summary

The Jackson Guards Memorial is located next to the levy facing south in Jacksonport State Park on the west end of the mall at the intersection of Washington and Avenue streets. The sculpture is of a standing male figure clasping a rifle, butt to ground, with both hands. The proper left hand is above the proper right hand at stomach level. The figure, a Confederate private, is dressed with hat, jacket, pants, and boots typical of the time. A bed roll is draped over his proper left shoulder. The base, which is made of granite, is 20'x10'x10'. The sculpture, made of marble, is 6'x30"x30".

Elaboration

The Jackson Guards Memorial is located next to the levy facing south in Jacksonport State Park on the west end of the mall at the intersection of Washington and Avenue streets. The sculpture is of a standing male figure clasping a rifle, butt to ground, with both hands. The proper left hand is above the proper right hand at stomach level. "C S A" is written on the south capital of the base. Below this is a carving of crossed Confederate flags and a carving of crossed swords. On the south face of the base is the inscription: "THE JACKSON GUARDS WERE ORGANIZED AT JACKSONPORT, / JACKSON COUNTY, ARKANSAS, BY CAPT. A. B. PICKETT, / A PROMINENT LAWYER OF JACKSONPORT, SUNDAY MORNING, / MAY 5, 1861. THE COMPANY WAS MARCHED TO THE / PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH AND THERE PRESENTED WITH / A BEAUTIFUL SILK FLAG, MADE BY THE FAIR LADIES / OF JACKSONPORT. THE PRESENTATION SPEECH / WAS MADE BY MISS MARY TOM CALDWELL, / ASSISTED BY MISS PAULINE HUDSON AND / MISS FANNIE BOARD. THE SPEECH OF ACCEPTANCE / WAS MADE BY PRIVATE S. S. GAUSE OF THE COMPANY. / THEY WERE THEN MARCHED TO THE STEAMBOAT, / MARY PATTERSON AND WITH CAPT. MORG BATEMAN, / THE OWNER AND COMMANDER, THEY TOOK PASSAGE / FOR MEMPHIS, TENN. AND FROM THERE WENT TO / RICHMOND, VA. THEIR DESTINATION AT THAT TIME." This is followed by "THE ORIGINAL MUSTER ROLL OF CO. "G". FIRST ARK REG. INF OF / JACKSON GUARDS" and a list of the officers of the Jackson Guards. Below this is "1861 1865," a list of the non-commissioned officers, and at the bottom of the base, "CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS."

Arkansas, 1886-1934 as a commemorative monument financed and erected through the efforts of veterans and other local citizens in Arkansas. As such, it is eligible under Criterion A with statewide significance for its associations with the efforts of the people of Jackson County to reflect their perception of the noble character and valor of their veterans and their cause. Thus, it also meets the eligibility requirements of Criteria Consideration F: Commemorative Properties.

Elaboration

The Jackson Guards Memorial was sponsored by private subscription and was unveiled on November 26, 1914, at the Jackson County Courthouse in Newport. It was built to honor the men from Jackson County, known as the Jackson Guards, who fought in the Civil War. It was erected in Newport rather than Jacksonport because Jacksonport, a river town, had been in decline ever since the railroad was built through the county in the 1860s. The unveiling ceremony, which was viewed by what the Newport Daily Independent called an "immense audience," was a festive occasion that included many pro-Confederate songs and speeches.

The courthouse eventually fell into disrepair, however, and in May 1962 the Jackson County Historical Society received permission to renovate the area. As a result, the memorial was moved to its current location at the state park and re-dedicated on June 5, 1965 as part of the centennial anniversary of the Confederate surrender in Arkansas. Gov. Orval E. Faubus spoke to a crowd estimated at 2,500 at the ceremony, which also included a dedication of the new state park and a new plaque commemorating the surrender. The Jackson County Historical Society won the 1971 Award of Merit from the American Association for State and Local History for their renovation efforts.

The Jackson Guards Monument is significant for its association with the turn-of-the-century movement in Jackson County to commemorate its soldiers who fought with for the South in the Jackson Guards. Though moved from the grounds of the Jackson County Courthouse in Newport (NR 11/18/76) to its present location some 30 years ago, it now rests on the grounds of an earlier Jackson County Courthouse at Jacksonport State Park (NR 01/21/70). It still retains its associations with the Civil War commemorative period in Arkansas and is thus eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places with statewide significance under Criterion Consideration B.

The Jackson Guards Memorial is associated with the historic context "Something So Dim It Must Be Holy": Civil War Commemorative Sculpture in Arkansas, 1886-1934 as a commemorative monument financed and erected through the efforts of veterans and other local citizens in Arkansas. As such, it is eligible under Criterion A with statewide significance for its associations with the efforts of the people of Jackson County to reflect their perception of the noble character and valor of their veterans and their cause. Thus, it also meets the eligibility requirements of Criteria Consideration F: Commemorative Properties.

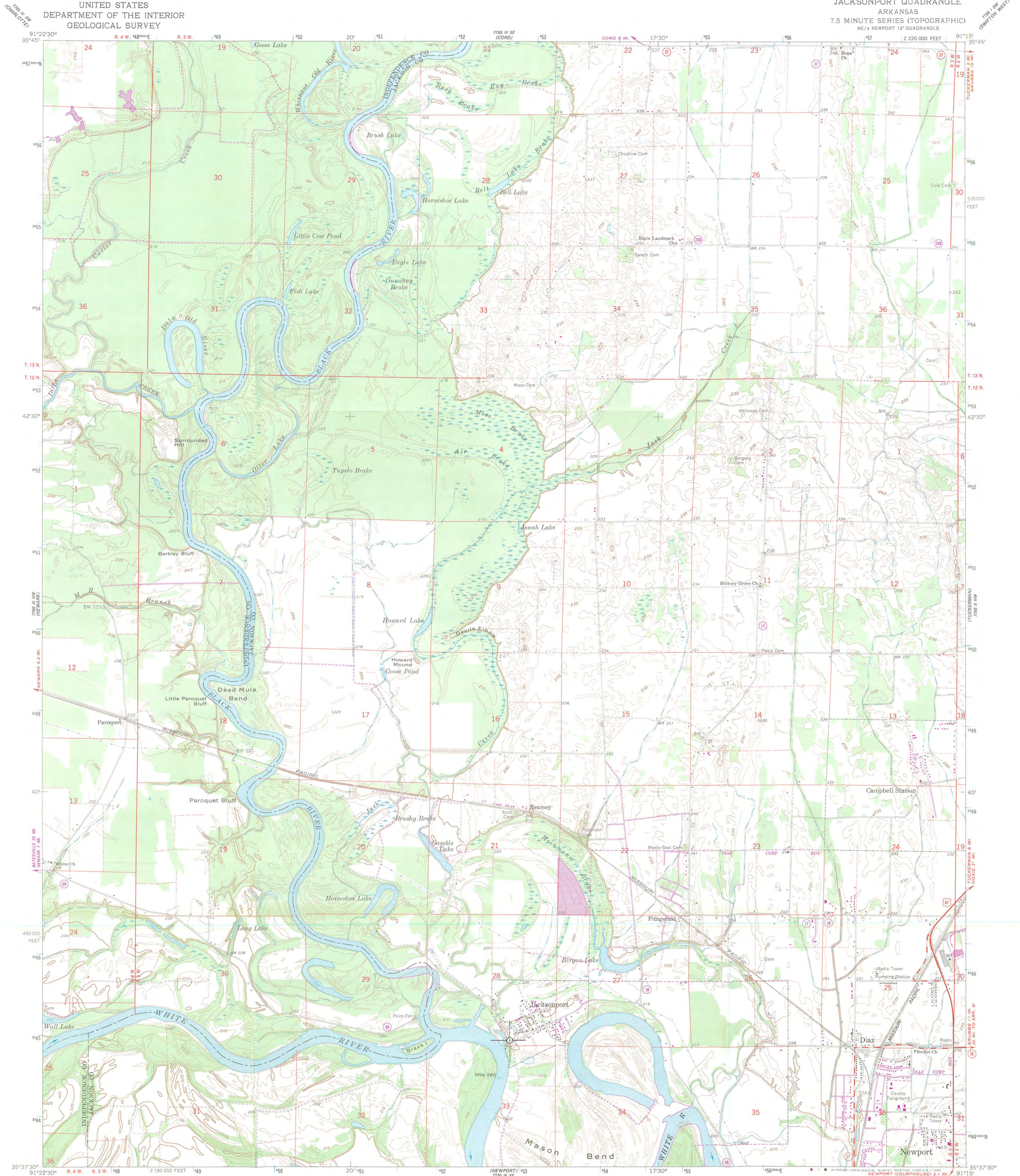

REASONS FOR THE MOVE:

The Jackson Guards Memorial is proposed for relocation due to the planned construction of a new Visitor's Center at Jacksonport State Park in Jackson County, Arkansas. The proposed Visitor's Center will be located within a tract of the old town measuring roughly 285 feet by 285 feet (86.9 meters by 86.9 meters) that includes eight original town lots, and portions of an alley and adjacent street right-of-way (Lots 1-4 of Block 5, Range 1E and Lots 1-4 of Block 6, Range 1E). This Visitor's Center tract is bounded by the White River levee (which was constructed over former Jefferson Street) to the southwest, Avenue Street to the southeast, the projected former location of Adams Street (now closed in this block) to the northeast, and a row of shrubs on a property line to the northwest. Conceptual plans for the Visitor Center show the new facility being constructed at or nearly at the current location of the Jackson Guards Memorial.

EFFECT ON PROPERTY'S HISTORICAL INTEGRITY:

The proposed move will have minimal impact on the Jackson Guards Memorial's historical integrity. First, the monument will only be moved a short distance, approximately 325 feet (99 meters), to the northeast and placed in another portion of the park in essentially an identical setting as it currently occupies. Secondly, the Jackson Guards Memorial memorializes the sacrifices of the local Confederate States of America (CSA) soldiers in general. The placement/location of the monument as it is today is not correlated with any event associated with its present position. Finally, when the monument was built in 1914, the monument was originally erected in Newport, and subsequently moved to Jacksonport after the state park was created in 1965. When the monument was listed on the National Register on April 26, 1996, it had already been moved once.

INFORMATION ON THE NEW SITE:

The proposed site for the Jackson Guards Monument is on the existing brick sidewalk roughly halfway between the present location of the monument and the old Jackson County Courthouse. The distance from the existing location to the proposed location is approximately 325 feet (99 meters). Two brick planters and a wider section of sidewalk currently mark the proposed site, which lies to the northwest of the two small trailer-like structures that currently house the Ranger's Office and Visitor's Center.

The proposed location for the monument exhibits essentially an identical setting as its present location. It will remain southwest of the old Jackson County Courthouse in a well-maintained and landscaped portion of the park. Panamerican Consultants, Inc., archaeologically tested the proposed monument site during 2014 as a part of the Visitor's Center Phase II investigations (Buchner et al. 2014). Work conducted at the proposed monument site included the excavation of two one meter by one meter test units. The proposed monument site is largely associated with a former alley ROW between Blocks 5 and 6 of Range 2E, and is currently the location of two modern brick planters. The Phase II excavations resulted in the identification of a relatively shallow (25 centimeter), low-density cultural deposit. No features were identified, and future research potential of this small area was deemed low. No further investigation was recommended.


