DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building and site are owned by the St. Louis and San Francisco Railway Company. The company still utilizes the structure as a freight office with a one man staff, but there are plans to close the office in the near future. In such instances, according to company officials, it is customary to demolish the building to preclude cost of maintenance.

The architecture is the type designed for the semi-humid coastal plain for the southeastern portion of Oklahomakis entirely different from the average semi-arid climate for the rest of the State. An outstanding feature is wide over-hangs which extend eight feet from the exterior brick walls. Modillions undergird these overhanging eaves. The roof is covered with clay tile with eyelid dormers on the the north and south faces. These features have been plastered over because of window breakage in the past. The building has dimensions of twenty-four feet by one hundred and two feet.

The structure is sound despite the fact that it has received little or no maintenance in recent years. Extensive interior renovation will be necessary to make the building fully useable.

The railway station is to be the focal point of the commercial historic district in the older part of downtown Idabel. The placement of this structure on the National Register of Historic Places will aid in this process.

The building stands today essentially as it was constructed sixtyseven years ago. There have been no significant alterations and no additions during its existence.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Frisco Railway Station in Idabel was constructed in early 1912, at a cost of \$10,000 for the St. Louis and San Francisco Railway Company by E. M. Vanderslip and Company of Oklahoma City. This brick structure replaced a smaller frame building that had served the town from 1902, when this was still a part of the Choctaw Nation. at 2001 or 1995 of the State of the Choctaw Nation. at 2001 or 1995 For almost forty years the staion was a center of commercial tanding social activity in the town. Four passenger trains daily served the area in addition to the heavy freight schedule. During the first decades of the twentieth century, the line was the only common carrier serving Idabel, making the Frisco Station is major entrance into and from the town.

The railroad was critical to the growth of the town, so much so that the name Idabel came from the daughters of a railroad official of the period. The two girls were Ida and Belle Purnell. This important community landmark remains a part of the identity of the town.

The McCurtain County Historical Society, as a part of their historic survey effort, nominated the Frisco Station. Their motivation is to preserve this historic structure which is in immident danger of being razed. In their statement, they noted: "If it is destroyed, an important part of the heritage of Idabel and McCurtain County will be irrevocably lost."
