DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Greenway is a frame, one-and-one-half story structure, built in the latter half of the eighteenth century, which is representative of a great many colonial homes in its design and scale. The beaded clapboarding, wood-covered gable roof with its row of dormers, and the symmetry of the five-bay (south) front are combined in the classic form of the medium-sized Virginia home. The brick foundation walls are primarily of Flemish bond, but the occasional lapse into English bond suggests possible stages of growth not visible elsewhere in the building fabric. The two exterior end chimneys are in Flemish bond and have double, tiled splays. The two-bay rear ell which projects from the center of the north facade dates from the early-nineteenth century, and, except for a slight change in bed and crown moldings on the box cornice and the newer window framings, the addition uses the same forms as the older section.

The central hall has a closed stringer stair with square newels and turned balusters which ascends southward along the west wall. At the top of the stairs there are unusual twin newel posts with engaged balusters facing each other between the two posts. The stair hall, as in all the others in the original front block, has a single board dado and a chair rail composed of simple roll moldings on a raised board. The west room is dominated by a projecting fully-paneled chimney breast in which fluted pilasters frame the architrave molding around the fireplace opening. These pilasters rise to a cornice shelf from which four more pilasters rise to a ceiling cornice. Subtleties in this chimney woodwork, such as the double row of dentils directly under the cornice shelf and the double crossettes in the architrave framings, make it an exceedingly fine design. By contrast, the projecting chimney breast in the east room has a plain architrave framing around the fireplace opening with a shallow frieze and beautifully carved cornice shelf above. Three rectangular panels and ceiling cornice make up the overmantel design. The chimney designs in the two upstairs rooms are a simplified version of this mantel but without the overmantel. Architrave moldings frame all doors in the front block of the house and much original hardware remains.

The breezeway which connected the rear addition to the main house was recently filled in, and the design of its interior attempts to conform with the interior feeling of the original house. This rear room, with its dado of horizontal boarding and chair rail, features a typical early-nineteenth century mantel of oval sunbursts and deep shelf.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

This well-known eighteenth century building form combined with fine interior detailing make Greenway an ideal example of the prototype looked to for twentieth century colonial revivals. However, in spite of its fine architectural character, the historical associations of the house constitute, its chief importance. The house was built by Judge John Tyler (1747-1813), Governor of Virginia (1808-1811), who is buried there. John Tyler raised his family at Greenway, and in this house in 1790 was born his son John (1790-1862), later tenth President of the United States. President Tyler lived at the house until his marriage and later returned to Greenway while Governor of Virginia (1825-1827). He sold the property in 1829 when he purchased nearby Sherwood Forest which was to be his permanent home for the rest of his life.

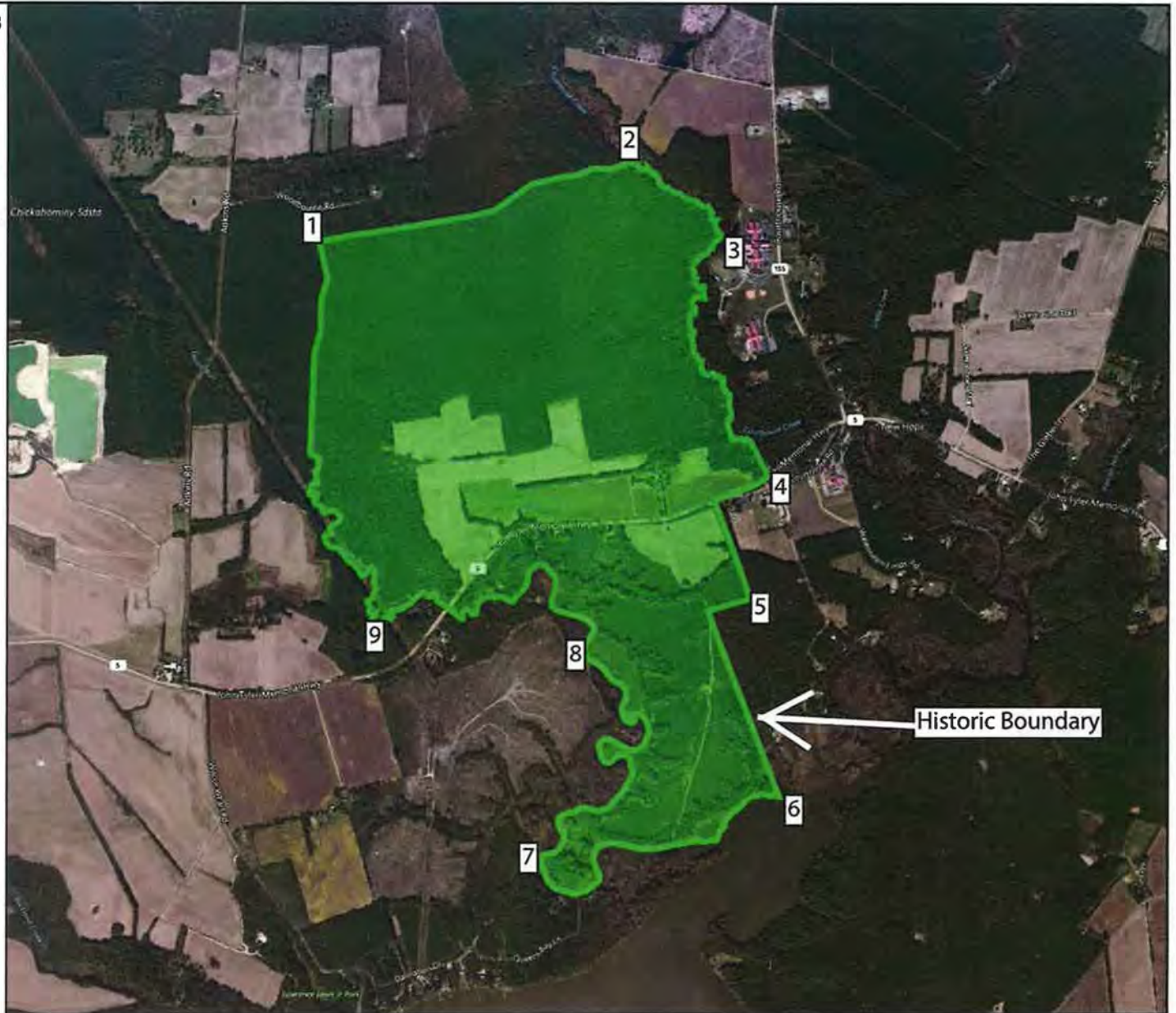
