

Architecture:

The architectural significance of this house—it is a largely intact brick version of the standard Greek Revival I-house—is enhanced by its location on the historic main north—south route through the county, Old Louisville Road, presently US 31W. An unusual feature, the stone blocks at the ends of the cornices, perhaps link the house with the nearby Wa-16 and with an elaborate Greek Revival structure in Bowling Green, Wa-B-167.
