DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Campion Hall is located on the shoulder of a plateau above the northeastern shore of Lake Cochichewick. Its major facade faces northerly toward Great Pond Road across a gentle swell of open land. To the south the mansion overlooks an open field which is narrowed by an advancing forest of evergreens as it slopes down to the shore of the lake. Among the woods flanking the eastern edge of the 86-acre estate, are various outbuildings: a tea house, two cottages, and several former farm buildings.

Campion Hall was built from the plans of Boston architect Stephen Codman, and completed in 1906. That date is carved on the lintel of the fireplace in the mansion's living hall, and the house also appears in the 1906 edition of J.L. Richards and Company's Atlas of Lawrence, Methuen, Andover and North Andover.

Campion Hall has suffered few alterations since its construction. Early in the twentieth century a brick and shingle guest house was added to the eastern end, and in 1959 a brick dormitory wing was built on the west. Within the house itself, the only major change has been the permanent enclosure of a formerly open porch along the southern elevation of the building.

The original mansion rises two and one half stories above a plan which is essentially T-shaped. The stem runs east to west and parallels Great Pond Road, and the cross piece lies at the eastern end of the stem and extends north to south. At the base of the stem, on the northern side, a wing of irregular plan and lower height is attached at an angle.

With its steeply pitched roof, picturesque massing, and informal plan, Campion Hall is essentially Queen Anne in style. The gable roof over the spine of the main house is intersected by three cross-gables, two at the eastern end of the T, and one at the west over the angled wing. All the major roofs are slightly flared at the eaves, and project some two to three feet over the faces of the walls beneath. The main roof carries nine dormers whose semi-octagonal forms are echoed in their roof structure, while the wing roof supports seven dormers with simple shed roofs.

The exterior wall covering is red brick laid in English bond, accented by blocks of cream-colored limestone used for sills, lintels, and at most major breaks in the wall plane. The majority of windows consist of double-hung, single light sash, grouped in threes in the semi-octagonal bays, or regularly disposed upon sections of wall where the plane remains unbroken.

The front elevation, which contains the main entrance, is to the north. This entrance, at the end of the northerly arm of the T, is prefaced by a porte-cochere whose details are the most elaborate found on the exterior of the house. Its open roof framing is embellished with carving, and the brick and limestone end wall boasts an exuberant baroque cornice above a wide, pointed-arched window opening. The form of this arch is subtly echoed in the two-story cross-gabled pavilion on the eastern side of the angled wing, thus relating the luxuriant detail of the porte-cochere to the more restrained masses of the mansion proper.

The interior of the building is replete with fine materials and handsome detail.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Campion Hall (Hardtcourt or the Kunhardt Mansion) was built in 1906 for George E. Kunhardt, owner of the George E. Kunhardt Company in Lawrence, Massachusetts. A native of New York City, Kunhardt went to Germany as a young man to study textile technology. When he returned to the United States, he came to Lawrence where he started the mill which eventually made him wealthy and a leader of the textile industry. In building his mansion on Great Pond Road, Kunhardt was emulating other textile manufacturers such as Nathaniel and Moses Stevens who had earlier built fine homes in the general vicinity of Lake Cochichewick.

In addition to his mill interests, Kunhardt was actively involved in the work of the Associated Industries of Massachusetts, was a member of the Lawrence General Hospital Advisory Board, and a director of the Merchants National Bank of Lawrence. Kunhardt's favorite hobby was raising prize livestock, and at his North Andover estate he built farmers' cottages and livestock sheds for that purpose.

The Kunhardt mansion is a highly individualized example of the eclectic architectural taste which prevailed in America at the turn of the century. Designed by Stephen Codman, an important Boston architect and good friend of Kunhardt, the building's planning and much of its form and details are of the Queen Anne style. Other exterior features, notably the treatment of the wall surfaces, the tremendous overhang of the eaves, and the baroque luxuriance of the front face of the porte-cochere are drawn not from the Queen Anne style, but from some of the German buildings which Kunhardt sent his architect to Europe to study.

In 1937, two years after Kunhardt's death, the estate was sold to the Society of Jesus, its present owner. The Jesuits built the 1959 addition to the western end of the mansion for use as dormitory space.

Beginning on said road by the pond at Flats Bridge, running easterly to an iron pin in the wall near a small maple tree where another road leads southerly to Lakeview Farm, thence southerly by this road 105 feet to the end of a wall at Lakeview Farm, thence in straight line westerly, crossing said wall to a stone bound at the pond 175 feet southerly of the end of the wall, thence northerly by the pond to the point beginning at Flats Bridge.
