19. History This property was owned by Robert Clark Jr., who may have built the house. Clark was partial owner of Red River Iron Works, which brought about his ruin. He was the son of Robert Clark Sr. (see Ck-25). He came to Ky. in 1782, was a state legislator from 1799-1801. Significance Owned first by Robert Clark, Jr. a cofounder of the Red River Ironworks, this is one of the earliest and most complete surviving rural complexes, and site in the Lower Howard's Creek area.
