DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Morrison Suspension Bridge on Black Bear Creek is a one-lane affair, 150 feet long. Its flooring consists of wooden planking on a light steel superstructure suspended from twin steel cables by hanger and spacing rods. The builder's plate is still in place over the roadway between the two south towers.

Though the bridge with its bent railings and rattling floor boards appears somewhat dilapidated and perhaps even a bit too fragile by today's motoring standards, it carries moderately heavy local traffic and is apparently still structurally sound ... provided one observes the carefully posted two-ton limit!

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Morrison Suspension Bridge, were it able to talk, might well echo the words of the Parisian after the French Revolution. Asked what he had done during those tumultuous years, he replied, not without a certain pride, "I survived." The cable span across Black Bear Creek has witnessed many changes over the past sixty years. It has taken them in stride and, while admittedly looking a bit the worse for wear, survived. In this tag end of a century that has witnessed more technological change than man has known in all his previous millenia on this planet, that in itself would seem to be no mean feat.

In the early years of the 20th century the suspension principle was widely applied in bridging small streams. The cable allowed use of lighter weight steel, which was not only less expensive, but also easier to handle - an important factor when heavy construction equipment was either non-existent or hard to come by, especially in rural areas.

This particular suspension design was patented by Nelson H. Sturgis of Guthrie, Oklahoma, in 1913. The bridge itself was built by the Noble County commissioners around 1917. Spanning Black Bear Creek on a half-section line road, it provided access from the south to the old Lela School and a pioneer cemetery. It still serves area farmers - a local landmark and one of the last surviving suspension bridges in northern Oklahoma.

VBD - The nominated area encompasses a plot of ground, 200' east to west and 260' north to south within section 11, T21N, R3E. This includes the bridge itself and a small buffer zone around it. Beginning at a point on the north/south half section road that divides section 11 in half, 550' north of state route 64, proceed east 100', north 260' crossing Black Bear Creek, west 200', south 260' across the creek, and east 100' to the point of beginning.
