The Cuppett's Covered Bridge, located in Napier Township, Bedford County was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1980 (NR Reference # 80003423), under the Multiple Property Listing "Bedford County Covered Bridges Thematic Resources." At that time, Cuppett's Covered Bridge was incorrectly misnamed as both "Cuppert's Covered Bridge" and as the "New Paris Covered Bridge". The bridge was built in 1882 by members of the Cuppett family, who lived next to the bridge site. "Cuppert" is an incorrect spelling of the family name and potentially originates from a handwriting error at the time of the 1980 National Register nomination.

Additionally, while the bridge is located near the Bedford County village of New Paris, it is not and was not identified or known by its location place name.

This Additional Documentation aims to correct a technical error in the earlier nomination regarding the historic, and preferred, name. This addendum also includes contemporary photographs of the bridge, highlighting its unique design and engineering, as well. Though the location has not changed, a refreshed map is also being submitted.

As noted in the 1980 "Bedford County Covered Bridges Thematic Resources" documentation, the Cuppett's Covered Bridge, "...is also an unusual bridge. Its extremely low burr arch is protected by low curving vertical siding leaving the bridge sidewalls open. Horizontal beams tie the end post and panel posts." The unique design of Cuppett's Covered Bridge set the bridge apart from the fifteen other Bedford County Covered Bridges that existed and were surveyed at that time.

In the years following listing in the National Register, Cuppett family members restored and maintained the historic bridge by repairing and replacing damaged and worn exterior wood cladding, and by repointing the original stone bridge abutments. No structural reinforcements, like steel beams, has been added to the structure of the bridge.

In 2015, the bridge was surveyed by the environmental and engineering firm AECOM as part of the Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office's *Disaster Planning for Historic Properties Initiative*. At that time, AECOM, surveyed, mapped, and photographed the bridge on a "Historic Resource Natural Hazard Vulnerability Survey Form" (PA SHPO key# 050723) Though the condition of the bridge in 1980 was noted at "poor," the physical condition of the bridge in 2015 was noted as "Excellent." The PA SHPO concurred with those findings.


