Describe present and historic physical appearance.

This house conforms to the property type "Residential Buildings and Complexes" and the property subtype "Double Pen House." Because of the small size of double pen houses (two rooms, each usually measuring approximately sixteen by sixteen feet), additions are not uncommon. This house has been enlarged in two directions, but the original core is still present and distinguishable. The main facade of the house faces north. A shed roof porch extends across this facade, supported by wood posts. One addition extends from the northeast corner of the main facade; the other extends from the rear (south facade). The dates of the additions are unknown. The house rests on brick piers. Board and batten shutters conceal the window openings.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Robert Simmons House is significant as a rare example of a vernacular architectural form once common to St. Helena Island. Although this is an early twentieth century house that has been expanded, the double pen house type has been one of the most prevalent forms in Southern architecture since the Colonial period. This house was built c. 1910 by Robert Simmons, a farmer. Robert Simmons' son Willie, also a farmer, was born in 1898 and has lived in the house since it was built.(1)
