Rather simple brick pilasters and arched windows with brick hood moulding provide only ornamentation. Windows are paired 4/4 sash double hung and smaller single $1/\overline{1}$ sash double hung. Low pitched roof with roof top vents for circulating air. Canopy shelters protect the loading docks of doublestrap hinged doors.
