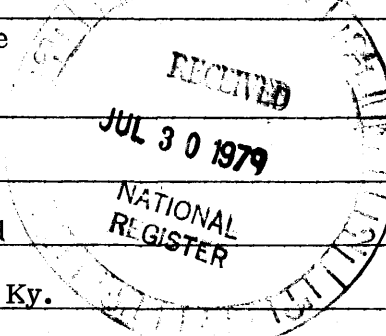


18. Description <b>The Henry Stevenson House is a two-and-one-half story, five-bay, brick structure with brick pilasters located at the corners of the facade and flanking the central bay. The two-story, pedimented portico supported by massive, wooden piers is a recent addition. Chimneys extending one brick from the gable end wall are flanked by rectangular windows. 19. History <b>The structure was built ca. 1835 by Stevenson on land inherited by his wife Jane from her father, James Duncan. Stevenson's 566 acres farm was sold in 1869 to John, Adam, Jacob, and Betsy Harper, well-known thoroughbred horse breeders, who amassed a fortune of nearly half a million dollars in the 1870s.</b>		Nominated acreage: approx. 14 acres	
20. Significance <b>The structure is a well-preserved example of the transitional style.</b>

**Verbal Boundary Description**

The boundary begins at point A (see U.S. G.S. map) on the east side of U.S. 62 and follows the private drive in an southeasterly direction for approximately 1800 feet to point B. The line then turns north for approximately 400 feet to point C. From point C, the line runs northwest for approximately 700 feet to point D on U.S. 62. The line then follows the east side of U.S. 62 for approximately 300 feet to the point of origin.
