land rich in oil and mineral deposits. In the early history of the young school this valuable land was sold, bit by bit, for as little as ten or fifteen cents per acre, to meet the salaries of the teachers. The early teachers were very notable men in this area. The first building was erected between 1806 and 1815 by the Masons, who used the second floor for a meeting room. This structure was destroyed by fire, along with all the records of the school, and the present building was built on the same site, in 1875 and the school continued to operate until it was sold through a Commissioner's sale to Dr. J. B. Kinnaird in 1893. Mrs. Hattie Ross bought this property for a residence in 1913 and for many years operated a boarding house. This remained her residence until she was 95 years of age when she died in 1980.

The interior has been renovated to accommodate this eating place, but the exterior of the building remains unaltered.


