

57. HONOLULU, HAWAII





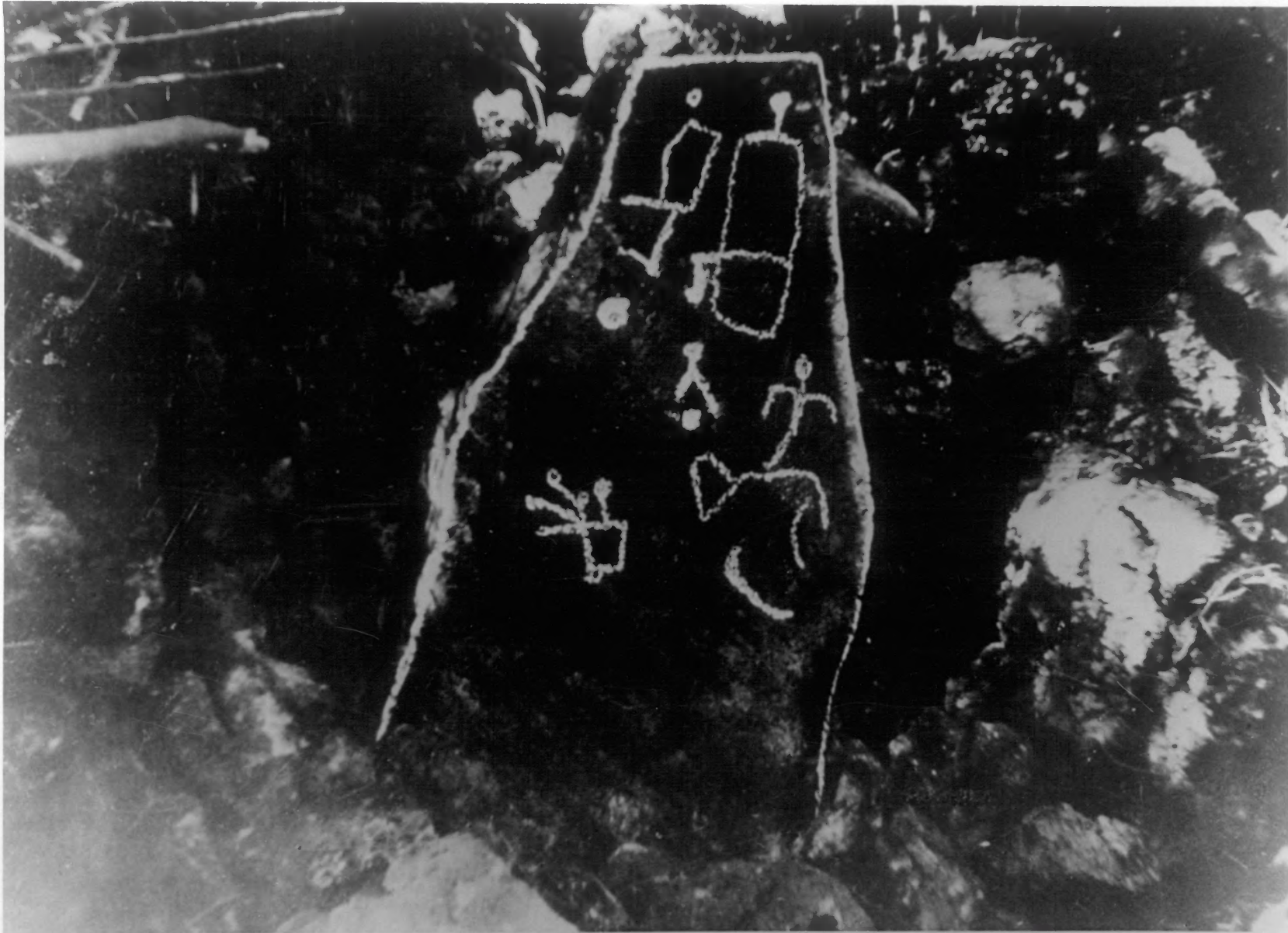
