DESCRIPTION

ARCHITECTURAL STYLE Neoclassical Revival DATE 1912 1 story branch bank, parapet above cornice, rectangular plan FORM with tripartite symmetrical front MATERIALS tan-brown facebrick on concrete block foundation FENESTRATION 1/1 d.h.s. below large transom panels egg-and-dart molding at cornice, on pilaster caps; pedimented FEATURES entrance pavilion with engaged fluted columns of Doric order; side entrance with metal hood hung on chains from the mouths of lion medallions, supported on "brackets" that are halves of a composite-order capital main entrance partly filled in for a smaller doorway ALTERATIONS SITE corner lot in neighborhood commercial district

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE During the period c.1900-1915, Davenport banking enjoyed significant growth that was architecturally expressed in new buildings downtown and in the establishment of neighborhood branch banks. The style employed was invariably some version of the neoclassical revival.

This little Washington Street bank is located in a small neighborhood commercial center, the focal point of which was the Northwest Davenport Turner Hall. A relatively simple building, the bank nonetheless displays the nearly obligatory engaged columns (here supporting a full entablature and triangular pediment) and pilasters with classically-detailed caps. This little bank merits consideration as part of an important commercial development in early 20th century Davenport, and as an illustration of the pervasive influence of neoclassicism on the buildings constructed in response to that development.



## DAVENPORT SURVEY 1982

Northwest Davenport Savings Bank was established HISTORICAL DATA in 1912-13 in a German-American neighborhood of northwestern Davenport. Its founders were of German-American descent, and lived and operated businesses in the Washington Street commercial district. The bank's original officers included Jacob S. Weber, a physician (president); Peter Peters, merchant (vice-president); and William Burmann (cashier).
