Being nominated is a ½ mile section of the original 1822 Byler Road. This unpaved section, bypassed by more modern roads, has retained it so original width of 12 feet and is flanked on both sides by densely wooded areas. Originally all soft places were laid with logs, and the road bed was clear of all stumps. Today, parts of the road have eroded, but the damage is minor. At the end of this ½ mile section is the Pruitt slave cemetery, dating from 1819.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			

Byler Turnpike was Alabama's first state road and the section being nominated has retained much of it original appearance and atmosphere.

The turnpike was named for John Byler of Lawrence County, the promoter of the road. On December 16, 1819, shortly after Alabama became a state, Governor Bibb signed into law a bill authorizing Byler and his associates to build a turnpike and to keep all tolls for 12 years, provided that the road was maintained.

Completed in 1822, the road ran from Tuscaloosa on the Balck Warrior River to the Tennessee River near Muscle Shoals, linking the markets of the Tennessee Valley with the head of navigation of the Black Warrior River.

Many towns in Lawrence, Winston, Walker, Fayette and Tuscaloosa Counties grew up along the turnpike and during the Civil War, both Confederate and Union armies traveled the road.

The Tuscaloosa County Commission has recently acquired this section of the road and will maintain it in it's present condition for use as a historic park.
