Miss Emma Hicks Bungalow: MM-MS-132

The Hicks Bungalow, completed in 1922, is a one and one-half story, weatherboarded, cross-gable plan bungalow. Sitting atop the point where the gables cross is a rectangular dormer with triple windows on the east and west sides and quadrupled windows on the north and south. The wide eaves are accented by brackets at the corners and apexes of the gables. On the front porch the brackets are rounded and extend beyond the roof line. Within the front gable of the porch is an oriental motif. The windows on the front or south facade are quadrupled with diamond patterned mullions in the upper halves of the windows.

Garage: MM-MS-132 A

A one car garage is located to the west of the residence. It is a rectangular, weatherboarded building with a gable roof built at approximately the same time as the dwelling.

The Miss Emma Hicks Bungalow in Mt. Sterling, Kentucky is significant under criterion C as the best local example of the Bungalow style. The dwelling, which dates from 1922, retains its original exterior detailing and has not been altered. The building's exterior reflects more of the craftsman detailing associated nationally with the style than any other Bungalow in Mt. Sterling.

The Bungalow style as a whole is not very prevalent in Mt. Sterling. A total of twenty-two examples have been surveyed in the Northwest and East Mt. Sterling Districts. The Bungalow style became popular nationally after 1910, a period which coincided locally with a cooling of the building boom and industrial expansion in Mt. Sterling. The few dwellings built during the period were sited on lots created during the late nineteenth century expansion and typically reflect the slowdown of the local economy with a display of minimal ornamentation.

In 1920, T.C. Geary filed a plat for Bella Vista Subdivision. In 1922, lot 16 was sold to James Richards, who sold it to S.N. Williams later the same year (DB 73/252). In 1923, S.N. Williams sold the house and lot to Miss Emma Hicks. (DB 73/602).



Verbal Boundary Description

Starting at a point on the northeast corner of the lot or point A; then south approximately 80 feet along the west right of way of Reid Avenue and continuing around the corner approximately 50 feet and then northwesterly 120 feet to the northwest corner of the lot or point B; then east along the north property line of the property to the point of beginning or A.

Boundary Justification

The boundary was drawn to exclude the modern residential dwellings less than fifty years of age. Consequently the nominated area consists of the two architecturally significant resources, the dwelling and the garage.
