This is a one story brick hall and parlor house with original rear lean-to extension. There are end wall fireplace chimneys, a Greek Revival style cornice with paired freize brackets, and a symmetrical five bay facade. The house remains in original condition and despite the proximity of Terry Motor, it maintains its historic integrity.

Statement of Historical Significance:

Construction Date:

The early construction date of the Horace Skinner house makes it one of the oldest of the brick and stone houses in Beaver. The house is significant because it marks a clear transition from smaller log houses to larger more substantial dwellings of brick and stone. Such buildings reflect the first major period of Beaver's growth and development. The hall and parlor type house was found throughout the Mormon region but proved particular popular in Beaver. This house form, in its single-story configuration, was a typical middle-to-lower-middle class dwelling in Beaver.
