Summary

The 1934 Cuba High School Annex (Photos 1-8; Figs. 1, 2) is an example of Property Type II, commercial and institutional architecture as described in the Multiple Property Documentation Form, "Historic and Architectural Resources of Cuba, Missouri, 1821-1963," which is incorporated by reference into this document.

Elaboration

The Annex is a 2-story hip-roofed rectangular building built on a raised basement and finished in random ashlar native stone laid in a "giraffe" pattern¹ with grapevine joints. This is one of the varieties of stone finishes associated with "Ozark rock" construction.² The exterior walls are twenty inches in thickness (Photos 1-3). The building is 60 feet in length and 30 feet deep, with a symmetrical 7-bay façade which incorporates flat-topped window openings and a centered entry door accessed by a set of five stone steps leading to a concrete stoop (Photo 1). The stoop is also accessed from the north by a concrete handicapped ramp. The entry is shielded by a triangular hood of wood, supported by plain wood posts.

The window openings have been altered with the installation of non-historic wood siding, with most openings having paired residential-scale 1/1 replacement windows. The second-story window above the main entry is smaller than the others and has a single 1/1 window. (Photo 1)

The rear (west) elevation is penetrated by seven openings on the first story and none on the second (Photos 2, 3). The centermost opening on this elevation had a door opening onto a small wood loading dock; it has been in-filled. The other six openings have been treated in the same manner as the openings on the façade.

The south elevation has no openings on the first story and only a single-leaf metal door opening onto a metal fire escape on the second (Photo 2). A prominent exterior chimney, finished in stone to match the rest of the building, is on the north elevation and rises considerably above the roofline (Photo 3).

The interior of the Annex (Photos 4-7) retains classroom space on the first and second floors and mechanicals in the basement; a tunnel from the basement formerly linked the Annex with the high school which stood immediately to the east. Room partitions have been added on portions of both the first and second floors (Photo 6). The original wood stairs, with wood handrail and square wood balusters, access both the basement and the second story (Photo 7). The original hardwood floors are present on the first and second story (Photo 4, 7); the ceilings have been lowered and acoustical ceiling panels have been installed (Photos 4-6). The interior rooms are used as museum display space along with a research library in one of the second story former classrooms (Photo 5).

¹ The "giraffe" pattern is a local colloquial description of this distinctive form of masonry bonding which gives the physical appearance similar to the skin pattern of a giraffe.

A thorough discussion of this distinctive construction practice is found in the 2005 amendment of the 1999 Multiple Property Submission titled *Historic and Architectural Resources of Springfield, Missouri*. This amendment added the property type "Ozark Rock Masonry in Springfield, ca. 1910-1955" and describes the technique in detail. Setting





Fig. 2: Aerial view of the nominated property (indicated by the superimposed asterisk) shows the outline of the foundation of the 1905 school to the right. [from Topozone.com]

The Annex is located on a flat lot on the west side of North Smith Street, two blocks north of the central business district, in a neighborhood consisting of institutional as well as residential buildings. The building sits at the rear of the lot; the front portion of the lot was originally occupied by the 1905 high school (not extant). The uppermost portion of the high school foundation is exposed at grade (Fig. 2) and is considered to be a contributing structure since it clearly assists in the interpretation of the site as a whole and the Annex in particular. In the front yard of the Annex is the Cuba War Memorial (Photo 8), a non-historic non-contributing veterans' memorial commemorative object consisting of a polished granite obelisk capped with an eagle in flight, on whose sides are inscribed the names of veterans from the community who served in the wars from World War I until the present. The memorial was built with donations and was dedicated on Veterans' Day, 2008.

Summary

The Cuba High School Annex is locally significant under National Register Criterion A for *education* and for *politics/government*, as the only extant property associated with education in the community during the early twentieth century and as the product of the New Deal governmental employment programs. It is associated with three of the historic contexts set forth is the Cuba MPDF: "Cuba and the Farm Economy, 1919-1940," "Route 66 and the Great Depression, 1926-1945," and "Cuba Since World War II, 1946-1963." The period of significance for the property begins in 1934, the date of construction and ends in 1960, the dates when the building was used for its original public school purpose.

Elaboration

A detailed description of the historical development of Cuba and the economic and cultural forces which accounted for the rise of the community are described in detail in the Cuba MPDF. With reference to the High School Annex, the earliest educational building in the community was a one-room log schoolhouse built on the site of the Annex in 1854. It burned in 1880 and was replaced by a wood frame building which itself was consumed in fire in 1904. In May, 1905, a special election was held to pass a bond issue to build a new school and in July, 1905, a \$6,700.00 contract was awarded to W. J. Mitchell of Rolla, to build the new brick school (Fig. 1). When it was completed, the community offered eight elementary grades and two years of high school. In 1909 the high school curriculum was increased to three years but it would not be until 1922 that the fourth year of high school was added.¹

With the expansion in curriculum and educational policies, the 1905 high school (Fig. 1) was inadequate and in 1934 (some accounts report 1935) the Annex was built by local laborers with funds provided by one of the New Deal work relief programs, likely either the Civil Works Administration (CWA) or the Works Progress Administration (WPA). Under the CWA (prior to the WPA), 3,308 man hours were spent on "school buildings" (construction and improvement) in Crawford County.²

The southern first-floor room of the Annex was shared by the seventh and eighth grades, the northern room served the vocational agriculture and home economics curricula, while the second floor contained a study half, and the library. A music room was located in the basement.

Athletic fields were located across the street to the east. The building was used by the local school system until 1960, when a new school was built south of the downtown. The old high school was razed, but the Annex was left.

With consolidation and a new school, the High School, Annex, and athletic field were sold at public auction. William Recklein was the low bidder at \$10,000, and donated the entire property to the community. Recklein was a World War One veteran who became a community leader and served as the vice-president of the Bank of Cuba. The Recklein Memorial Library was completed in 1961 and occupies the former playing fields across the street from the Annex. In 1964 the Annex became the Recklein Community Youth Center and from 1991-2001 it served as the headquarters of the local police department. The Crawford County Historical Society, organized in 1968, converted it for use as a local history museum and genealogical research center in 2002.

Applicable National Register Criteria and Integrity

The Cuba High School Annex meets National Register Criterion A in the area of education, as a locally significant school building which served the community's educational needs from 1934 until 1960, a span which, as noted above, is also the period of significance of the nominated property. Also with respect to Criterion A, the building is associated with the area of politics and government, since it is the product of the New Deal-era Public Works Administration, one of the many jobs programs developed by the administration of Franklin Delano Roosevelt in order to offset the effects of the Great Depression.

Admittedly, its integrity has been somewhat impaired by the alteration to the windows, although the original openings are obvious and unimpaired. The interior plan is generally intact and it retains significant detains such as its original wood floors and staircases. The property retains integrity in most of its component elements and meets the registration requirements established for this property types in the MPDF.






Fig. 4: Geographical Data map with decimal degree reference.
