DESCRIPTION (Continued)

2 story masonry dwelling with flat roof and north and south side pavilions. Roof has bold, projecting cornice. The house is 3 bays wide in front with 2 x 2 sash in simple wood frames. Each window has a cut-stone block lintel and sill. The south side pavilion has a square bay window with tall window openings. A "u" shaped veranda stands across the front of the house. It has turned posts with small brackets supporting a shed roof. Windows under the porch are taller than the remaining windows. The entry is off-centered and features a paneled door with sidelights and transom. Attached to the rear is a 2 story ell with south side porch.

SIGNIFICANCE

This house was built for Patrick Murphy on land purchased from Ellsworth and Sarah Barker.
