#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Walter Hadley Home is a two-story, detached, dwelling approximately  $30' \times 40'$ . It has clapboard wall finish and hipped roof. There is an open porch which spans the entire length of the front facade and an attached carport, approximately  $15' \times 30'$ , on east side.

First story of front, or north side, has matching 20/1 double-hung windows to the east of front door and one large fixed-pane window to the west of front door. It has a 20-paned transom. Front door is wood panel type with single light in upper half. Second story has a centered hipped roof dormer with 1/1 double-hung window flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung windows.

East side first story contains one large 12/1 double-hung window in center, matching square-shaped 1/1 double-hung windows near northeast corner, and one narrow 6/1 double-hung window to the north of side entrance door. The latter is a wood panel type with light in upper half. Second story has a centered hipped roof dormer with 1/1 double-hung window flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung side windows.

West wall first story includes one 1/1 double-hung window flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung windows. Second story has one centered hipped roof dormer with 1/1 double-hung window flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung windows.

The rear, or south side, first story, has matching 20/1 double-hung windows in west half of wall and two 1/1 double-hung windows in the east half. Second story has one centered hipped roof dormer with 1/1 double hung window flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung windows.

Decorative elements follow the Craftsman Period tradition including four square-shaped clapboard porch columns; clapboard porch railing; column-like corner pilasters of clapboard on northeast and northwest corners of front facade; wide unenclosed eave overhand with exposed rafter ends; four central hipped roof dormers also with wide, unenclosed eaves and exposed rafter ends; and variation in fenestration and glazing of windows. Window arrangements include the four 20/1 double-hung types, two in front and two in rear; large fixed pane window in front with 20-pane transom; one 12/1 and one 6/1 double-hung window in east wall; and the square-shaped 1/1 double-hung windows flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung windows in each of the four roof dormers.

Alterations include an attached carport, approximately  $15' \times 30'$ , on east side; two window air conditioners in east and rear opening; four air vents, one in each of the dormers; and new wood shingle roof cover. All of these changes have occurred within the last twenty years.

These alterations have not seriously affected the historic integrity of the house.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Walter Hadley Home is architecturally significant because it is the oldest example of a Craftsman Period dwelling in Stroud.

Constructed in ca. 1910 during the early years of the Craftsman Era in the United States, the Hadley Home reflects the professionalism of the original owner and builder. Co-owner of the local lumber company in Stroud, Hadley used only the finest wood for framing material for the house. Decorative elements which exhibit the Craftsman Period tradition include four square-shaped clapboard porch columns; clapboard wall finish and porch railing; wide, unenclosed eave overhang with exposed rafter ends; four centrally located hipped roof dormers also with wide eaves and exposed rafter ends; and the variation in fenestration. Although deviating from the traditional Craftsman Period gable roof, the Hadley House presents an unusual combination of hipped roof and dormer arrangements which give the residence an overall sense of symmetry.

The Hadley Home, like all other Craftsman era houses, was a simple yet functional dwelling which represented the hard working character of this historical personality in the commercial and political development of Stroud. Although a carport has been added and roofing materials have been replaced over the years, the Hadley Home has retained the character and integrity of the Craftsman detailing envisioned by the builder when he constructed it 75 years ago.

The nominated property sits on a beautifully landscaped lot in the original townsite of Stroud.
