### Description of present and historic physical appearance:

Brightwell Shotgun Row is a complex of six, closely spaced, double-shotgun houses located on Barber Street north of downtown Athens and adjacent to the Boulevard Historic District. Built between 1935 and 1940, the six nearly identical double-shotgun houses are set back-to-back in two rows with three facing Barber Street and a second row of three facing Crawford Avenue, a small, unpaved lane at the rear of the property.

Each house is clad in beveled wood siding and set on brick piers with a recessed concrete foundation. The front-gable roofs are covered with galvanized sheet metal. Brick chimneys are set at the ridgeline. The symmetrical facades feature two doors and two windows. A few original paneled doors remain. The windows are two-over-two double-hung sashes on the front façade and nine-over-nine sashes along the sides. Full-width front porches span the main facades; smaller enclosed porches at the rear functioned as bathrooms and utility rooms.

Historically, the interior plan of each shotgun house featured four principal rooms and the enclosed rear porch. A wall running from front to back divided the interior into two separate side-by-side living spaces. Coal-burning fireplaces heated the front rooms.

The interior plans now include openings in the common wall when the buildings were converted from multiple-family to single-family occupancy. Interior finishes are plain. Coal burning fireplaces are located back-to-back and have no mantles. In some houses, baseboards and tongue-in-groove paneling survive.

#### Narrative statement of significance (areas of significance)

The Brightwell Shotgun Row is significant in the areas of <u>architecture</u> because shotgun houses, one of Georgia's better-known house types, have become increasingly rare with only forty-five shotguns and sixteen double-shotguns identified in Clarke County in 1994. The Brightwell shotguns represent six of only twenty-eight double shotguns identified in the 1947 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map. The Brightwell Shotgun Row is important as an urban form composed of two ranks of three buildings, the only back-to-back arrangement identified in Clarke County.

According to *Georgia's Living Places: Historic Houses in Their Landscaped Settings*, shotgun houses may be single-family dwellings, whereas, the double shotgun serves as a duplex or a multiple-family dwelling. The six Brightwell shotguns are characteristic of the double shotgun with two residential units that share a common wall. Doorways are aligned from front to rear with no hallway.

The multiple property nomination form, "Architecture of Athens-Clarke County: Shotgun Houses," identifies the urban shotgun row district and the urban single shotgun. A shotgun row district is defined as a group of three or more shotgun buildings that are contiguous to each other and face a common street. The Brightwell shotguns are unusual because of building type and arrangement. The double shotgun form is limited almost entirely to Georgia's ten largest cities. In addition, urban shotgun row districts are commonly found on only one side of the street. The context notes that it is rare to find a street in Athens with shotgun houses on both sides of the street. The double row, back-to-back arrangement appears to be uncommon and thus is an important character-defining feature of the property.

The Brightwell Shotgun Row is specifically identified in section E on page 8 in the multiple property nomination form, "Architecture of Athens-Clarke County, Georgia: Shotgun Houses." In addition, the Brightwell shotguns meet the registration requirements in section F, page 14-15. The registration requirements state that urban shotguns must retain a high level of historic integrity; consist of more than three contiguous shotguns facing a common street; establish a rhythm through the closely spaced buildings and consistent setbacks; and may feature small shed-roofed additions at the rear of the buildings, which are part of the historic development of the buildings. The Brightwell Shotgun Row meets each of these criteria.

The Brightwell Shotgun Row is significant in the areas of <u>black ethnic history</u> and <u>community planning and development</u> because the six shotgun houses represent African-American settlement patterns in Athens during the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The Brightwell Shotgun Row is located north of downtown Athens in an African-American neighborhood known historically as New Town.

The New Town neighborhood developed mostly on the north side of the Seaboard rail line, which separated the African-American neighborhood from the Boulevard neighborhood, a white streetcar suburb located between New Town and downtown. Beginning in the 1890s, New Town formed north of the rail line to serve industries along the Seaboard Railroad, such as the Gulf Refining Company, Standard Oil Company, and Southern Cotton Oil Company, the R.L. Moss Manufacturing Co., and the Talmadge Brothers Corn Mill. Numerous dwellings were built along Athens, Savannah, Augusta, Atlanta, and Cleveland avenues. In addition to dwellings, New Town also includes schools,

### Period of significance (justification)

The period of significance begins in c.1935 when Helen Brightwell built the first three double-shotgun houses and ends in 1950 (the fifty-years-of-age cut off) to in include the period when the buildings served as housing for African-American tenants.

#### Contributing/Noncontributing Resources (explanation, if necessary)

The six shotguns occupy the entire National Register property. There are no other buildings, structures, sites, or objects associated the nomination.

#### Developmental history/historic context (if appropriate)

In 1934, Helen Brightwell purchased the undeveloped shotgun property and the next year built the three double-shotguns along Boulevard and completed the remaining three by 1940. City directories from the 1940s record one family residing in each building indicating the double shotguns were converted to single-family dwellings soon after their construction. The directories also indicate that the occupants were primarily working-class African Americans, including a laundress, cook, mechanic, janitor, presser, laborer, fireman, and gardener.

In 1944, Bertha Jones, a nurse, and her husband M. C., a bellman at the Holman Hotel, purchased the property from Helen Brightwell's estate and continued to let the houses. Clifford L. Brooks purchased the property in 1987. Brooks sold the shotguns to Addie G. and Waverly Brinkley, Dorothy Grier, Harry Campbell, and Gloria Johnson in 1992. After having been vacant for many years, the houses were purchased by the current owner, Thomas Wells Scott, III, who rehabilitated them. The houses are now rented by students at the nearby University of Georgia in Athens.




Brightwell Shotgun Row Athens, Clarke County, Georgia Sketch Map National Register Boundary Scale: 1" = 325'




374 Barber Street








368 Barber Street




